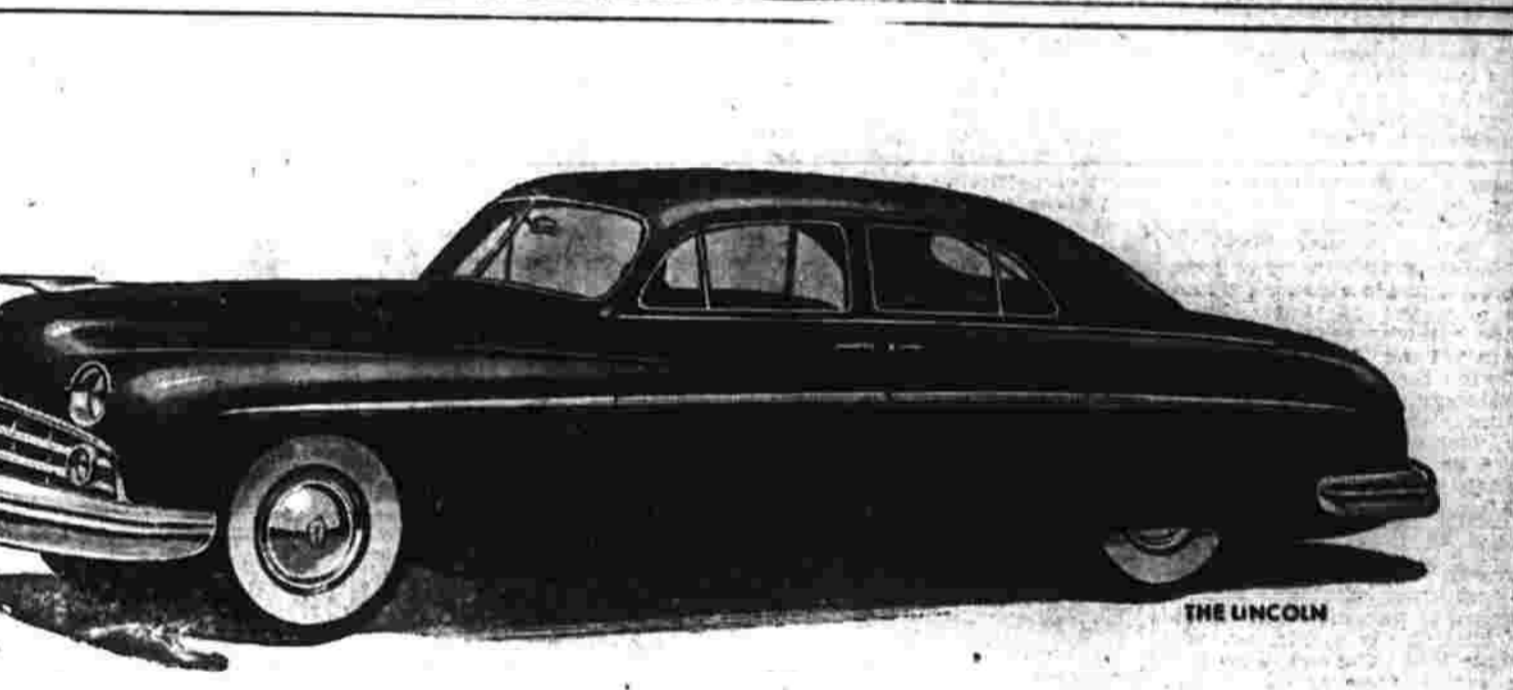

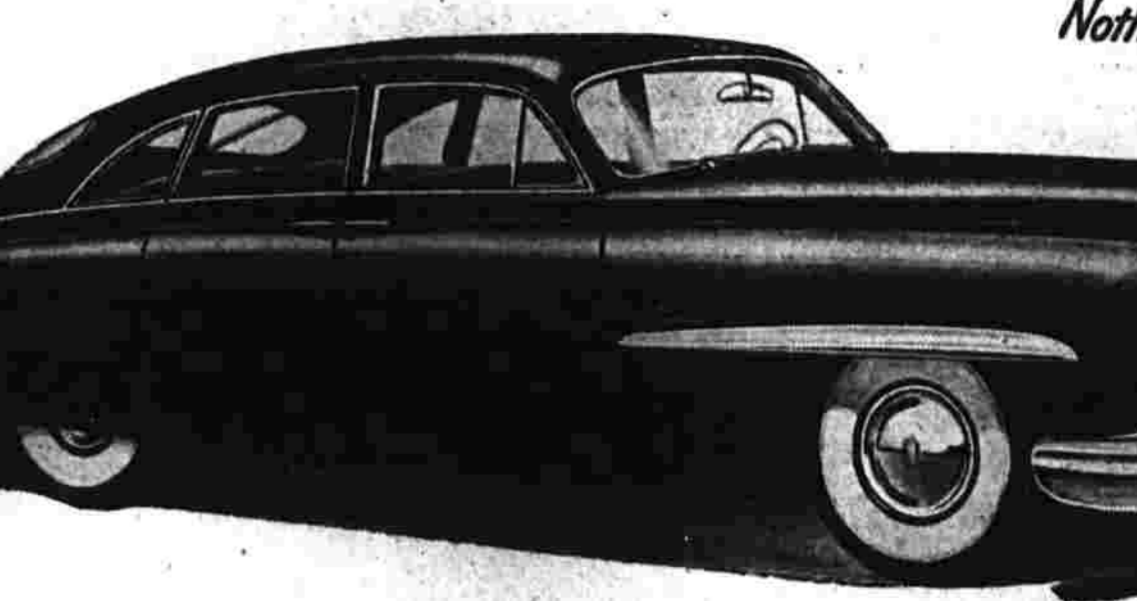

Lewis Argues La Requires No Bargaining (Continued from Page One) In fighting against a Danbury injunction three months ago, Federal Judge Luther M. Lewis ruled against the union on both counts. He granted an injunction requiring the La to observe certain practices pending a decision by the NLRB as to whether the practices violate the Taft-Hartley act.

Hopkins also said an injunction would impair the obligation of the parties to the 1947 "soft" coal agreement.

Concerning this Lewis pointed out in his affidavit that the 1947 contract was amended differently from previous contracts and said it was deliberately written so as to exclude the Southern Coal Producers Association.

Lewis said this association was created with the purpose "to thwart, delay, obstruct and prevent the making of contracts in true collective bargaining."

Called "base and seditious" he said the association's "hostile, anti-labor, reactionary, negative and adamant attitude" has been the cause of government action in 1945, 1946, and 1948.

He quoted the present contract as saying "it is hereby stipulated and agreed by all parties signatory hereto that they, and each of them, will attend any conference or conference committee on the terms of this agreement."

The Southern association is not a signatory to this agreement, Lewis said the union is "necessarily willing to discuss" and has been willing to meet with the coal producers of southern coal and their local associations.

He said they will not meet with any individual that these signatories certify as their agent, and that includes John R. Lewis, president of the Southern Coal Producers Association.

But he said he can not deal with the association because it is "a paper organization and its membership and propaganda are limited to a few men in the mines and twice removed even from the few companies."
