Mediator Told To Name Time

Bernadotte to Decide On Hour and Day of Truce for Palestine

Lake Success, June 2.—The United Nations has instructed a Swedish mediator to fix the date and hour for Jews and Arabs to stop shooting in Palestine.

The Security Council set no time limit on the mediator—Count Folke Bernadotte of Sweden—the United States was reported ready to insist that fighting stop by Sunday.

At the appointed time—when Jews and Arabs had agreed to lay down their arms for four weeks. During that period, emergency efforts will be made to settle their differences peacefully.

Parts of Beirut, Syria, the June president of the Council, ruled that Arab and Jewish acceptance of the Council appeal for a month-long armistice were unconditional. "Servers have taken this to mean that only the fixing of the deadline hour is needed to bring the Holy Land to a stop."

He discussed safeguards for the Jewish community during the armistice period. One major delegation expressed bewilderment at the session and predicted it might be cancelled.

The Council decision was called to Bernadotte in Cairo. He has been using a special airplane to fly to Jerusalem. He is expected to arrive in Jerusalem on Friday.

The letters began with a suggestion from Bernadotte to call a truce.

To the latest suggestion that he withdraw from the race, Mr. Truman replied with a sharp declaration that he was not brought to run from a fight.

The White House labelled the "White House" non-political but disclosed plans for five major addresses and a score of more off-the-cuff remarks.

Mr. Truman sets out at 10:00 p. m. (e.s.t.) at Chicago tomorrow night after brief talks at Fort Snedden, Md., today.

The presidential special will turn eastward again from Los Angeles to Chicago on June 3.

Determined To Battle Rebels Truman in a letter to the House said that he would not be deterred by the determination to battle party rebels, most of whom he named.

Jews Occupy Several More Strong Points

Israeli and Egyptian Forces Battle Near Irbid on Coast; No Details Are Given

Cairo, June 2.—(AP)—Jewish forces are occupying several more strong points at the approach to Irbid, Israeli headquarters announced today.

On the Palestine coast, Israeli and Egyptian forces battled near Irbid, 25 miles south of Tel Aviv, headquarters said. No details were given.

Arabs Bomb Tel Aviv Arab planes bombed the Tel Aviv area again today.

The Jews said they lost the initiative of the offensive yesterday morning when they mistakenly ordered a cease fire on the assumption that the United Nations Security Council had intervened.

As the U. N. mediator set about the task of fixing a date for the start of four-week negotiations, Farouk of Egypt advised the Jews to hold off until the Security Council had intervened.

King Abdullah's Ministry of Defense announced which attacked a Trans-Jordan police station near the Dead Sea. The Jordanians had lost 50 killed after Arab reinforcements arrived.

The mediator, Swedish Count Folke Bernadotte, working out of Cairo, was told to fix the day and hour by the U. N. Security Council, meeting yesterday in Lake Success, N. Y.

Armistice Offer Accepted The Council's plan for an armistice for the entire period of the four-week negotiations was accepted by both sides—the Israel government and the Arab League.

The United States was said to want the armistice to start by Sunday. But Jamal Husseini of the Palestine Arab Higher Committee told U. N. secretary-general A. G. R. J. van der Grinten that Israel night called for a "cease fire" in the Holy Land.
