Washington, June 6.—(AP)—Associated with today Republican Senatorial hopeful Robert A. Taft is counting heavily on midwestern support in what may be his last drive on the third or fourth congressional ballot.

Although Taft himself has declined to say whether there are signs that the Ohio senator's friends are trying to get cozy with some of Harold E. Stassen's midwestern delegates.

Stassen now has Minnesota's 20 votes tucked away, along with 19 of the 27 in Wisconsin. He will get most of the 10 votes in Michigan on the first ballot. He claims a majority of the 23, but the Taft camp credits him only six there, claiming 14 for themselves.

The Taft people are hoping for a breakthrough in the 14 Michigan votes they are lining up for Vandenberg. If the Vandenberg camp finally puts his foot down on those who have been trying to boom him for a nomination he says he doesn't mind.

Egyptian Forces Try To Get Out of Trap; Weigh Truce Replies

Fighting Continues in Several Sectors of Northern Palestine Today; Egyptians Land Troops on Coast in Attempt to Rescue Forces Encircled at Iddud, Close to Border

Cairo, June 6.—(AP)—Egyptian forces tried to battle out of a Jewish coastal trap and fighting continued in several areas of northern Palestine today while Arabs and Jews weighed their replies to the latest four-week truce proposal.

Land Troops on Coast Egyptian forces landed troops on the coast in an attempt to rescue forces encircled at Iddud, 10 miles south of Tel Aviv and three miles south of the Israeli border. Jewish forces last Friday turned back four Egyptian vessels, two of them landing craft, in a battle off Tel Aviv.

The Jews said they have surrounded 1,000 men of an Egyptian force of 5,000 on the coast, and were attacking in the area yesterday. The Egyptian truce proposal was rejected by the Jews.
