

Bennett said the company has 140 buses on order and 115 of them will replace the trolleys. The company has 32 buses available for immediate service now, he said, and expects delivery of 70 more next month.

Partial replacement of the trolleys will be made by July 3, Bennett said, with the entire operation expected to be completed by

To Cost About \$2,000,000 Bennett said the changeover from trolley cars to buses would cost the company, a subsidiary of the New Haven railroad, about \$2,000,000. He gave the cost of a 38-37 passenger bus at \$15,000. that of a 40-passenger bus, \$17,200. Some of the replaced trolley cars will be sold to second-hand trolley car dealers, Bennett said, while others, the copper trolley wire and the tracks will be sold for scrap.

There's a bull market in used trolley cars these days, Bennett reported. A second-hand, fourmotor job brings about \$200 now.
