Manchester's largest frame business block was threatened, and smoke and water damage in the thousands was listed last night as fire broke out in the basement of the Wonder Market, \$55 Main street, and spread havoc through the Rubinow building in which the market business is located.

Stock and fixtures in the stores, in business and professional offices above, and in the basement was ruined and tenants of 14 apartments were driven to the street. Flames were not a dangerous factor in this fire due to prompt action of the South Manchester fire department in combatting it, but smoke billowed from the structure and no part espand and no part escaped.

It was quickly answered by Companies 2, 3 and 4, comprising all of the south end's protection on the east side. No. 3 hooked up to a hydrant at the Marlow building, No. 4 stretched lines from Park and Main and No. 2 hooked in on Purnell place.
