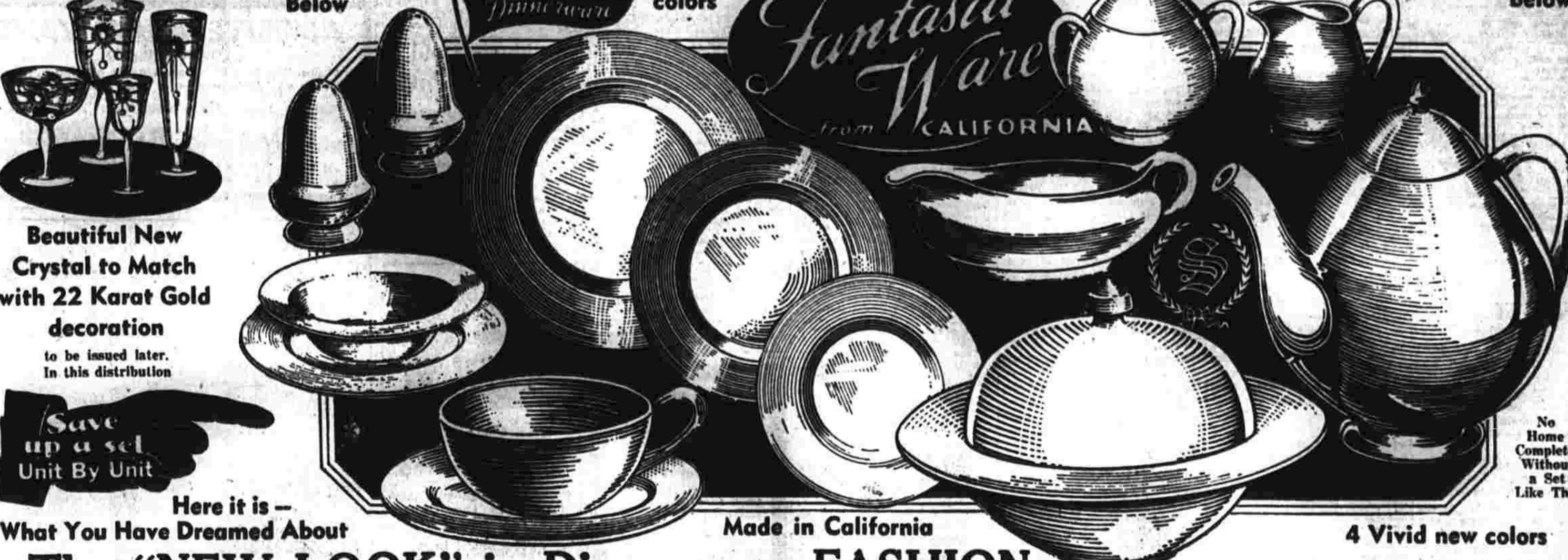

Who Are The Federalists?

The cause of World Federalism in America today is chiefly represented by the organization known as "United World Federalists."

The organization believes in a world governed by a single law to guarantee peace.

Its first, main objective is this: It wants to have the United States take the lead in bringing about formal discussion, among the nations, of the possibility of a limited world government.

The United World Federalists want the United States to be the Virginia of modern times.

Their energies and activities are all directed to that first goal—to have the proposal of limited world federation become the official policy of the United States government.

These methods are simple and direct. They try to inform and educate the American people. They ask the American people, in turn, to express themselves, by petition to Congress, by state referendums, by supporting and encouraging members of Congress and candidates for office who have shown awareness of the federalist destinies of our times.

It is natural and inevitable that, beyond their main, first objective, the United World Federalists have also concerned themselves with suggestions as to the nature of the world law which needs to be created. Likewise, they have formulated their ideas of the various approaches this nation might employ once it decides to sponsor the proposal.

In this field, the United World Federalists refrain from laying down arbitrary blueprints; they submit their own suggestions, open to discussion and amendment; they are quite willing to have world federalists take their own final shape in the course of discussion and negotiation, as did our own Constitution.

We intend to outline and discuss these proposals of method, as we also intend to outline and discuss the preliminary draft of a Constitution for World Government, which was produced, after over two years of study, by the Chicago University Committee to Frame a World Constitution. This remarkable document, again, is not intended to be a rigid blueprint, although it is indeed a complete constitution. It is intended, rather, to show, in legal terms, what a world federation might look like. Perhaps it will become the basis of actual discussion among nations. Perhaps not.

Meanwhile, the essential proposal of the United World Federalists, the proposal on which Americans themselves should accept or reject the federalist issue, is the specific proposal that this country, fulfilling the most manifest of all its potential destinies, should call the nations of the world into formal federal convention. If you believe it should, you are a federalist.

Diabolical Or Whistful?

On the surface, it appears nonsensical and untenable that the United States should use its influence in the United Nations to deny to Soviet Russia the function of sending military observers along with those of other nations, to function as true observers in Palestine.

The Game of War

The New York Times, in all its gracious majesty, concedes that this country owes "prompt and generous settlement of all claims" to the "tragic error" in which 14 Korean fishermen were killed and 10 injured when planes of the United States Far East Air Force, indulging in bombing practice, mistook a collection of Korean fishing boats for "cloud shadows or off-shore rocks."

This particular slip of our military muscle cost only 14 lives. But this is the present instance of a continually a stake as the world continues to play the game of war.

We suggest something still better, to be added to our apologies and reimbursement, in dollars for lives, in this present instance, we suggest that the United States military cease its infernal and incessant shooting of its missiles in foreign territories and foreign waters.
