The company last week granted an eight per cent pay increase to 125,000 members of the CIO Unit-

Wilson said company production costs have risen about \$72,000,000 since the firm cut prices by a total of \$80,000,000 last January and April.

He said the price increases "in no way provide for still higher costs which may result from wage demands from suppliers."


