handita" the officer said. "That's what's happening on Athens." "Unofficially reported last night, Rebel leader Markos Vamvakis, 600 guerrillas and 1,000 men reported them to have about 7,000 men in the 1,000-mile-square area of the Peloponnese.

There was little news here concerning fighting on the western side of the pocket, where several Rebel leaders, including the late Greek leader Markos Vamvakis, were reported to have taken refuge.

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(A Tel Aviv broadcast heard in Rhodes said the Jewish government ordered Irgun disbanded and its members immediately deported into the Israeli Army.)

"Chicken of Tomorrow" At A & P Markets Today
