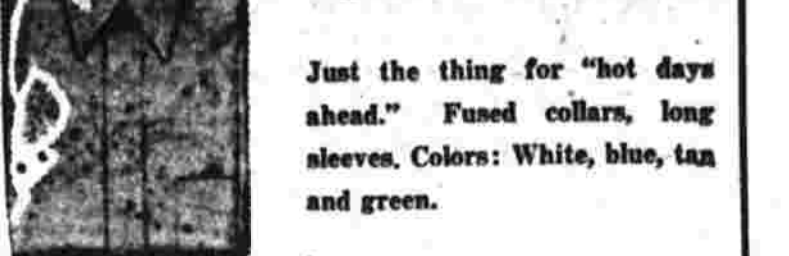

Fukui Area Again Shaken; Toll Set At Lower Figure

Military Government Officers Estimate Casualties Will Mount To 2,500 Dead and Injured Japanese; Relief Reaches Scene

Fukui, Japan, June 28.—(AP)—The shattered Fukui area felt new earth tremors tonight. Military government officers estimated Monday's earthquake casualties would mount to 2,500 dead and injured Japanese.

Military government officers said 200 children were crushed to death when a motion picture theater collapsed in the first quake. Their bodies have been recovered.

City Heavily Damaged Americans here who went through the quake said it was almost as if Fukui, which was leveled by Super-Forté in this war, was hit by an atom bomb.

The first tremors burst water mains, cracked gas pipes, and damaged houses and structures, went down in the first quake. Ninety-five per cent of what was left was burned and scorched and turned into rubble.

Jet Planes Set to Hop To Europe

16 Fighters to Make Exploratory Transatlantic Trip; To Leave Base About July 7

Washington, June 28.—(AP)—The United States Air Force, which some day may need quick reinforcement in Europe, will send 16 jet fighters off on an exploratory transatlantic flight next week.

The mission of the trip, said a U. S. A. F. announcement today, is "to determine the feasibility of ferrying jet-propelled combat aircraft over the route, study the logistical and operational problems involved and get in some limited training overseas."

Along Stepping-Stone Route The first overseas flight of U. S. A. F. jets will be along the stepping-stone route from England to Germany.

In Britain, the fighters will pay a visit to the R. A. F. base at Odiham from which the British jets are scheduled to depart July 1 for a visit to the United States.

The American planes will then fly to the R. A. F. base at Odiham, where they will be based until July 7.

Going ahead with the jets will be two C-54 transports and one C-47, carrying maintenance and operations staff in an event of the jets being forced down.
