Assault Due To Insanit

Carpenter Acquitted But Not Set Free; Committed to Hospital New London, July 1-(P)-A:

x-sailer, who stripped himself naked and brutally beat a dergyman ked and brutally beat a dergyman and his family after invading their home last year, has been acquitted, on grounds of insanity, of a charge of assault with intent to kill.

The defendant, Cedric C. Carpenter, Jr., was not set at liberty following his acquittal yesterday in Superior court. Judge William J. Shea who tried the case without a jury, rilied that he be committed to the Norwich State hospital (for the insane) for ten years. If, during that period, Carpenter should be adjudged sane, he may then apply for his freedom.

Carpenter previously had been committed to the mental institution a few days after the Rev. Nicholas Shepler, 58, the ciergy-man's wife, Flora, 51, and their daughter, 17, were found beaten and severely injured in their Gro-ton home on May 28, 1947. He was released last June 11 when he was

found capable of standing trial.

When the trial opened last week, Mr. and Mrs. Shepler testified they were awakened early in the morn-ing of the assault to find Carpenter in their home. Carpenter, i furnace shaker and then turned on their daughter, the couple testified.

The defendant, discharged from

the Navy during World war 11 af-ter being treated for a mental condition, told the court be was driven by "veices" to go to the Shepler home. He testified that remembered nothing of the attack except "a lot of screaming and hollering and me hitting." No motive for the assault was given during the trial, although Carpenter testified that his married life had been unhappy. The former sallor was married in June, 1944, to Mrs. Shepler's sister, Lil lian, nearly 30 years his senior and The Rev. Mr. Shepler performed the ceremony.




