Chinese Reds Free Four Marine Fliers

Taipei, China, July 2.—(AP)—Four U. S. Marine fliers held captive by Chinese Communists since April 5 were released today, the Navy announced.

They are Lt. Harold W. Hawkins, 23, of 1601 Grand avenue, Kalamazoo, Mich.; Capt. Thomas J. Shaw, 32, R. 4, Winfield, Conn.; Robert C. White, 23, Norfolk, Va.; and Capt. Robert R. Lewis, 19, R. 1, Petersburg, N. Y.

The fliers were forced down in Communist territory on Shantung peninsula while on routine flight. They were captured 15 miles west of here.

Navy officials said they were in good health when returned here today.

Lieutenant Hawkins said the quartet had nothing to do but play cards during the three months they were held. He said the Communists lectured them and gave them Communist literature. They were fed very fresh food and were free to disorganize both.

They were fed an average Chinese diet, Hawkins said.

Worcester, Mass., July 2.—(AP)—Business in downtown stores fell off sharply today as a strike of 600 bus drivers on the Worcester street railway went into its second day.

Wages are the center of the dispute. The drivers are seeking a 38-cent hourly increase; the company has offered four. Drivers now get \$1.35 an hour for the work week.

Testing Blight Proof Tomato

Milford, July 2.—(AP)—A blight proof tomato is being tested here at the trial grounds of F. H. Woodruff and sons, Milford seed growers.

George W. Skirm, director of vegetable breeding projects for the Connecticut Experiment Station, told a meeting of seed dealers yesterday that the tomato had been developed by the United States Department of Agriculture.

The tomato, said Skirm, has been grown here during the past four years. It has been tentatively named Red Top, and is similar to Rutgers in size, appearance and maturity period.

Skirm said that from four years of testing, the new tomato seems to be the answer for the blight which has caused extensive crop damage in Connecticut tomatoes two years ago.

Singapore, July 2.—(AP)—The Malayan Federation government tonight proclaimed the death sentence mandatory for anyone convicted of owning unlicensed firearms. The step was taken to counter the mounting violence which has claimed six more lives in the past 48 hours.

Hartford, July 2.—(AP)—The penny increase the General Assembly tacked on to the gasoline tax will add \$4,000,000 to the state's receipts, Motor Vehicle Commissioner Elmer S. Watson estimated yesterday.

The tax was raised from three to four cents effective July 1, 1947. The three-cent tax yielded \$11,568,180 for the 1946-47 fiscal year.

Watson said receipts from the four-cent tax will be \$12,000,000 as of last May 31, with three months still to go in the fiscal year.

expected momentarily. This would clear up whether they intended to sign the agreement and possibly a shut down of their mines July 6, when the miners' 10 day vacation ends.

May Not Return

Lewis' union newspaper has broadly hinted that the 30,000 to 40,000 miners in the steel-owned mines may not return if the so-called "capitulation" has been signed to the new coal agreement by them.

Such a strike would shut down mines capable of turning out some 60,000 tons of coal a year for fueling steel mills. The industry, which is a major source of supplies elsewhere, but coal stocks are still short because of the six-week mine shut-out.

One reason for steel's delay in making known its decision on the Lewis contract seemed to be that it is negotiating new wage terms with the CIO Brotherhood of Steel.

Earlier this year steel generally adopted a policy of wage increases and no price increases. It rejected a pay boost for steelworkers for that reason.

Chicago, July 2.—(AP)—A hot week-end appeared in prospect for most of the Midwest but the east states got relief after a few days of humid weather.

Temperatures well into the 80's were forecast for most of the north and west for the next two or three days. Hot weather continued in the midwest and over the mountain states. The temperature was seasonal along the Pacific into the eastern seaboard and the mercury was near normal marks.

Yesterday's highest marks were in the desert region of California—Avalon, with 111 at Yuma, Ariz., and 110 at Phoenix and Blythe, Lake, Calif.; Sioux City, Ia., reported the top mark in the midwest heat belt, 95.

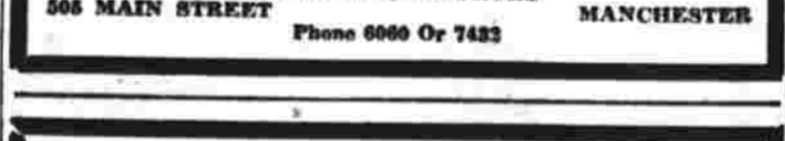
