Directors' Account of \$2,000.00 and printing in the amount of \$1,000.00. Controller's Account, increased to cover the securing of additional clerk and purchase of accounting machine for budget work, amounting to approximately \$6,000.00.

Auditor's Account indicates an additional sum of \$1,000.00; making a total of \$4,000.00 per year, of which \$1,000.00 is taken from Water Department and the balance from this Account.

Assessment Account is increased slightly, but I recommend a review of all personal property during the coming year at a contract cost of \$2,500.00 which is included in the amount of \$21,076.00. The Town Clerk's Account is increased, caused by the change over from "Miscellaneous" Account to Town Clerk and the payment of \$2,100.00 for recording Soldiers' Discharges. The contractual item of increase in the Town Treasurer's Department is caused by the charging of items under this heading for note and bond authentication, formerly charged to Miscellaneous.

The change in the budget from \$75,000.00 to \$80,000.00 is caused by additional Institutional and Hospital increases in cost. The additional cost of \$21,000.00 is caused by cost of living adjustments, representing \$14,000.00, snow removal costs in the amount of \$8,000.00 and additional cost of replacement of tools.

Additional costs of police protection is caused by increased cruicer coverage of the entire Town, thus adding 4 officers at a cost of \$16,060.00, making it possible for us to furnish additional protection in the form of 4 cruiser cars 16 hours per day, instead of only 2 as at present. Supernumerary work increased \$2,000.00 for the year, caused by work for First National Stores and Bryant & Chapman, which is refunded and reflected in receipts other than taxa-

PARKS AND RECREATION Increased from setimated cost this year of \$82,640.00 to recommended cost for next year of \$104,183.00. It is recommended that the adjustments between the Recreation and School Accounts be discontinued, effecting a saving in this Department of approximately \$6,000.00. The Beard of Directors approved the taking cover of the personnel at the Y. M. C. A. as a Town expense, thus increasing the cost to the Town of \$5,000.00, cost of Hving adjustment in the amount of \$4,000.00, additional maintenance of playing fields \$1,000.00, additional life-guards at Pools \$1,760.00, new furniture in Recreation Buildings of \$1,000.00, and additional work on all the playing fields, especially the West Side, or "Four Acres," in the amount of \$3,000.00, bringing up the total to approximately \$16,000.00 for added facilities for this department. It might be well to mention that the general public has used all our facilities this year more than ever and we are planning the additional facilities to take care of the demand.

It will be noted that this appropriation is decreased approximately \$254,000.00, caused by the finishing of the Veterans Housing Project on Middle Turnplite. The amount of \$26,038.45 as called for in the budget will take care of managing the Housing Project and the operation of the Veterans' Center. EDUCATION In the new form of budget, the General Manager under this heading Schools and Public Libraries. This year the Town Meeting, and the Board of Directors, included in the budgets an additional tax or two mills for the creation of a Reserve Fund for non-recurring expenses. 





