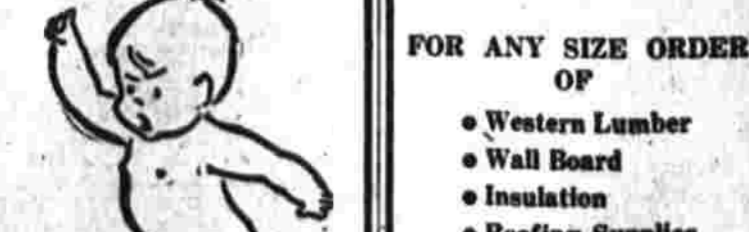

War On Again
 The war is on again in Palestine. For this fact, the Arabs seem to be the immediate villains. For their refusal to accept the United Nations' terms, although the Israeli accepted such an extension. But the basic root of the Arab trouble lies deeper than this. It is the fact that there is war in Palestine today because the great nations of the world, with the United States leading them, have played a game of politics, indecisiveness and revenge which has permitted Arab war sentiment to rise and strengthen itself.

Little Assembly Acting Up
 Something interesting has been going on in the United Nations Little Assembly, that organization which was originally created, on the suggestion of the United States, as a sort of device for keeping the UN Charter from falling in conflict with the theory that the Little Assembly, as a world forum, might operate as an arena for discussion of subjects which are blocked in the veto-dominated Security Council. It was, in other words, an anti-UN strategy on the part of the United States. Russia automatically refused to have anything to do with the Little Assembly. That body, however, has already lifted itself out of any purely negative role. It has bitterly ignored the absence of any Russian members, and also has shown that it has proved a little more vigorous in its own right than the United States expected. It has, in fact, turned into something of an outlet for the feelings and opinions and convictions of those smaller nations who have the highest ambitions for the United Nations, and who do not indulge themselves either in bypassing that organization or in converting it into an agency for their own power politics quarrels.

Two More Cracks
 Two more significant events have occurred in the Little Assembly. One, the march of the Sokols in Prague, with their cheers for the Soviet Union and their relative silence toward the Communist leaders, with their display of American flags, might have been expected. The Czechs, through centuries of foreign domination, have always been quick to sense any weakness of the dominators, always quick to find means of resistance to their oppression. The march in Prague is rather soon for the attacks made on him by the Communist party. They are selected men, chosen as the flower of Communist youth. They have been receiving the party line straight from its organizers.

Stress Being Put on Loans

Washington, July 9.—Emphasis in the European recovery program switched today from giving dollars away to putting them out on loans.

Three months ago today, the Economic Cooperation Administration found it easier to furnish outright grants to the Marshall plan countries than to negotiate repayable credits.

But the foreign assistance act requires that \$1,000,000—or about 20 per cent of the first-year recovery funds—be set aside for loans to finance specific recovery projects.

Must Advance Negotiations Richard Bassell, assistant deputy director of the Economic Cooperation Administration, said today that the agency now feels that loan negotiations must be advanced promptly.

The use of loans on a substantial scale must begin at once, he said, and the program must be kept going.

Two "large" loans are being negotiated now, Bassell said. And within the next weeks he expects to announce a number of other loans.

ECOA hopes to have \$750,000,000 in credits on its books within three months of the start of the program.

Such a large amount of money could draw funds as needed for the development of roads, railroads, mining, harbor and other industrial projects.

Such loan-financed projects can play a major part in the expansion of European production and employment, the ECA officials feel.

Such loans, however, are not so good economically as direct grants, which will be confined to grants throughout the first year at least.

This financial aid is being given to the United Kingdom, France, Italy, Greece, Belgium, the Netherlands, Luxembourg, and the Federal Republic of Germany.

These will be the first of the loans to be made available under the program.

It is expected that the program will be expanded to include other European countries in the near future.
