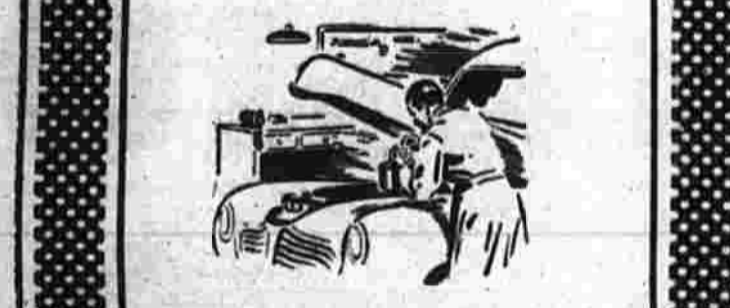

### Miners Return To Pits Today

#### Both Coal and Steel Operations Stepped Up Toward Normal

Pittsburgh, July 15.—(AP)—Wives of most of the coal miners packed off dinner pails today—their breadwinners were back in the pits.

Both coal and steel operations stepped up again toward normal following settlement of the "cap-tive" coal strike. The strike had tied 55,000 of the so-called "captive" miners—they're employed by steel companies.

In addition, better than 25,000 miners in noncaptive pits who had downed their tools in sympathy, returned to work. They were employed in Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Maryland and Virginia.

At least 22,000 working miners are employed in Pennsylvania and at least 22,000 of them are working today, a survey disclosed. Many went back to work on late shifts last night, others were put out this morning at the United Mine Workers said.

The UMW officials said the only thing holding back a complete return to work were routine meetings being held in local areas. They held after each strike—and after John L. Lewis, president of the United Mine Workers union, had passed along the word to go back to work.

Contract Viewed Illegal  
The "captive" mines went down on July 6 when most of the nation's 400,000 soft coal miners returned from their vacation under a new one-year contract, which gave them a 31-cent-a-day boost. The steel companies refused to pay the increase, saying the contract was illegal under the Taft-Hartley act because it called for a union shop.

Under a union shop miners must join the UMW within a specified period after they are hired.

However, the government will draw its suit for an injunction against the UMW after Federal Judge T. Alan Goldsborough has granted a one-year contract signed upon the UMW's promise to modify its union shop clause should later court rulings require it.

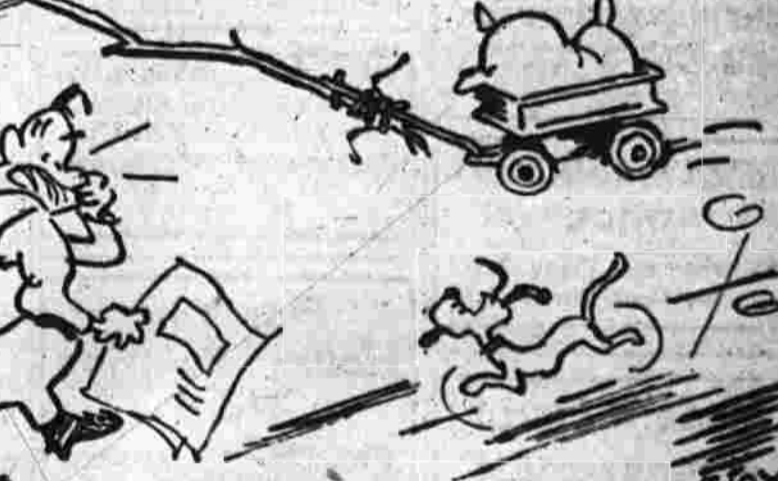

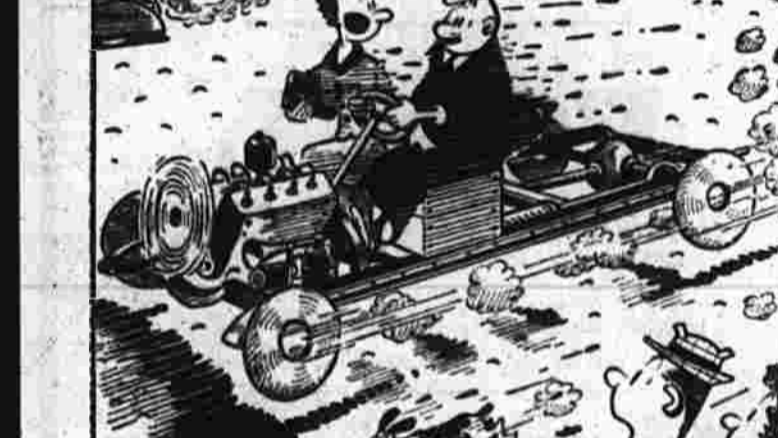
