





Estimates now range between that and 9,000,000 for the vote total likely to be amassed by Wallace and his running mate, Senator Glen Taylor, erstwhile Idaho Democrat.

But if the new party convention opening officially here tonight itself gives Wallace almost no chance of election, there was none in the Republican or Democratic Action stood before the Wallace Platform committee and denounced them to their faces. Turbusel in turn denounced the witness and the spectators cheered.
