Hospital Here to Get Allotment of \$200,000

One of Four State Institutions to Share in \$446,567 from the Government

The Manchester Memorial hospital is one of three Connecticut hospitals and one Connecticut hospital that were allotted a total of \$446,567 from the Public Health Council of the State Department of Health. The Manchester hospital's share of the total is \$200,000.

When William P. Slower, superintendent of the hospital, was contacted by The Herald this afternoon, he said that as yet he had received no official notification of the allotment and therefore could make no statement as to the disposition of the funds. It is believed, however, that the funds will be used for construction purposes since the funds were made available by the Federal government to allocate to one-third of the total needed for hospital construction, and including some items of equipment. Maximum contribution allowed was \$200,000.

Others Sharing Allotment
Besides the Memorial hospital, other hospitals in the same category, are: Windham Hospital, Inc., \$200,000; Willimantic Hospital, \$145,567; and the Milford Health Center project, \$100,000. The other hospitals were listed in the "A" priority and not in need of beds to reach the recommended minimum for Connecticut of 4.5 general hospital beds per 1,000 population.

The Public Health Council, which administers the act for Connecticut, on May 13 of this year had allocated a total of \$388,900 to several other hospitals for the fiscal year which ended July 1.

Earlier allocations had been distributed as follows: Danbury hospital, \$100,000; Willimantic Community Memorial hospital, \$154,423; and Shiron hospital, \$34,560. Today's allocations brought the total thus far distributed this year for hospital construction to \$355,567. This amount is in addition to the hospital made today was to cover upward revision of earlier cost estimates.

Allocations were made by the Public Health Council in a session held Wednesday by the State Advisory Council on the hospital and medical profession survey conducted at program. This advisory council is composed of medical leaders and others.

Boundaries of State's 25 Boards Are Tentatively Fixed
Manchester young men who are included under the new Selective Service law will be required to register in Hartford's 25th Senatorial district, according to a tentative list released today describing the geographical boundaries of the 25 draft boards which will administer the new law in Connecticut. Col. Morehouse announced that he had tentatively fixed the boundaries of the boards, and that they would be made final by the War Relocation Authority.
