Truman Tells Republican Legislators There Has Been 'Blind Disregard' for Danger; Taft Asserts President Does Not Want to Stop Inflation and Doubts Use of New Powers
Washington, July 30.—(AP)—President Truman fired a new demand for anti-inflation laws at Congress today, saying they are needed "to forestall business collapse." He told the Republican legislators there has been "blind disregard" for the danger.
Senator Barkley of Kentucky, the Democratic vice presidential nominee, jumped up at that. He accused Taft of making "a political speech" and demanding to know what powers Mr. Truman has and is not using.
Truman said the president has been making political speeches to Congress. He said Truman could influence the Federal Reserve board to tighten bank credit, could curb some stock and bond issues, could increase the price of government securities.
Taft's outburst was touched off by Mr. Truman's new call for legislation, made in the form of a resolution, to increase the Federal Reserve board to control installment buying and authority for the Federal Reserve board to increase required bank reserves. The idea back of increased reserves is that they would reduce money that banks might otherwise lend to people whose spending would increase inflationary pressure.

Rainless Day Brings Gloom Waynesburg, Pa., Residents Lose Wagers on Wet July 29

Waynesburg, Pa., July 30.—There is no joy in Waynesburg today—it didn't rain on July 29. The absence of precipitation may seem like a boon to some communities but to Waynesburg a rainless July 29 is like Christmas without carols or the Fourth of July without fireworks.

Have Been Accepting Bets Since then, the Waynesburgites—and a lot of former residents now making good in the bigger cities—have been accepting bets on the probability of rain in the old home town on the 30th day of July.

By and large, the bets were a little good going, because until this year it had rained on every July 29 for the last 71 years, except in 1868, 1890, 1907 and 1946.

Yesterday, as usual, the bets were down—including one made by Official Rainmaker John Daily with Charlie McCarthy of radio fame. Daily wagered a saw hat it would "make wet" in Waynesburg before last midnight. Charlie said it wouldn't.

The good people of Waynesburg, however, the weather bureau and rubber boots, couldn't that nature would not let them down. Daily assured an official spokesman that the town's first well-prepared to be in the act of new news of a wet Waynesburg.

Daily and his fellow townspeople waited, and waited—and waited. At midnight, e. a. t. they hurriedly set the clocks back an hour to 11 p. m. e. a. t.

It was to no avail. The rain fell less than one mile from town along the Blacksville Road, but that was in Waynesburg—although a movement was started immediately to incorporate the rain-soaked sector in the town's limits.

Finally, Daily admitted it had not rained in Waynesburg on July 29, 1948, and announced he was ready to send a new hat to Charlie McCarthy.

Pearson Quits Railroad Post Vice President Second Top Official to Announce Resignation

New Haven, July 30.—Robert L. Pearson has resigned as a vice president of the New York, New Haven & Hartford Railroad.

There was no indication in a railroad announcement of his resignation, however, that it was in any way connected with the impending change in the controlling ownership.

On the contrary, President Howard S. Palmer said last night that Pearson was leaving on account of ill health.

Palmer himself announced recently that he will ask for retirement August 12, the day of the stockholders' meeting at which a group headed by Frederic C. DuPont, 82-year-old Boston financier, is scheduled to take control.

A native of Philadelphia, the 66-year-old Pearson has been employed by the New Haven since 1904, two years after he was graduated from Strathmore college.

His first job was as inspector in the construction department, and he advanced through various executive posts until he became general manager in 1931. Since December, 1946, he has been vice president in the executive department.

"Mr. Pearson carries with him the very best wishes of his fellow officers and employees," the railroad said.

Tornadoes Hit Rural Sectors

Cooler Weather Moving Into Parts of Midwest Today

Chicago, July 30.—(AP)—Cooler weather today after a series of midwest tornadoes struck rural areas in Wisconsin and Iowa last night. No relief from the hot and humid weather appeared in sight for the eastern and southern states.

The twisters killed one child and caused some crop and property damage. They hit near Madison and La Crosse, Wis., and near La Crosse and Bluffs, in northeastern Iowa.

The Federal Weather Bureau said the tornadoes were associated with thunderstorms over an area from the north plains to the Great Lakes region and middle Mississippi valley. Strong winds were reported in several places.

A tornado which struck the Frank Ballweg farm home near Madison killed Lucille Ballweg, 10, and injured her parents and two other children. Three other children in the family were not injured.

The cool air moved into the midwest from the north from the northern plains, and extended as far east as the plains for settlement of the area.
