"Has Her House in Order"
In discussing the division of India and Pakistan, the speaker said, "At no time in history have so many people won political freedom with so little shedding of blood." With the democratic principles with which India is now imbued, said the speaker, she is a great potential ally for the United States. "India is the only country in Asia that has her house in order," he said, and he expressed the hope that American dealings with India will be governed by an understanding of the peoples of India. Rev. McLaughlin gave the Rotarians a view of the religious rebirth in India.
