Troutman, N. J., Aug. 6.—Six men accused of killing William Horner, a 67-year-old secondhand store proprietor, today were convicted of murder in the first degree and sentenced to death.

The sentencing, which climaxed a nine-week long trial, will result in what is believed to be the biggest mass execution in New Jersey's history.

Jury Deliberates Eight Hours

A jury of nine women and three men deliberated more than eight hours before returning a verdict shortly after midnight.

Judge Charles F. Hutchinson, who imposed the mandatory sentence at the week of Sept. 19 for the execution.

The six defendants, all Negroes, were James Thompson, 24; Charles English, 21; Ralph Cooper, 23; John McKenzie, 24; Horace Williams, 27; and McKinley Forester, 35.

William J. Robinson and the others are from Trenton.

They are charged with hearing Horner to death in the rear of his shop the morning of Jan. 27, 1948, in an attempt to rob his store.

Vacation shutdowns in which a number of workers were not entitled to vacation pay for the full period were responsible for most of the increase in initial claims which jumped from 4,500 for the previous week to 6,740 last week, the report stated.

Anniversary

Today is an anniversary. It is the third anniversary of the day on which by a cold decision that transcends the almost frantic advice of the very men who had created a new instrument of destruction, the government of the United States inaugurated the atomic age at Hiroshima.

Never before had any government or group of men made a single cold decision that the lives of some 70,000 innocent civilians should be burned out with one single blast. True, it had been the perverse and unrelenting effort of mankind to devise bigger and better means of self destruction for itself. True, history is full of men who would have welcomed the atomic bomb, and who would have used it, against civilians, if it had ever come into their power. True, the Nazis were capable of making a general decision which meant the lives of millions of people of what they called inferior races. But the decision to take 70,000 civilian lives in one surprise blast came from America, acting in the name of the people of America, acting even though we ourselves were not conscious of the fact, through our established government. And for us, our government decided to drop the bomb. It proved it meant, if it was dropping another. And it has since proved it meant both of those bombs by dropping bigger and better experimental bombs, warming up for some new opportunity to atomize mankind.

Even a hard-boiled military commentator, Hanson Baldwin of the New York Times, greeted our decision three years ago with the faithful observation that "we have seen the wind, and we shall reap the whirlwind."

Upon our consciences, over these three years, as it has been revealed that the very men who made the atomic bomb decision against its indiscriminate and unannounced use, there has been a growing sense of worry. As our best records into the past, we have come more and more difficult to remember the justifications for it, more and more difficult to reconcile it with what we like to think of ourselves as a civilized people.

Since that time, three years ago, what have we done to lessen the burden upon ourselves? What have we done amounts to this: that we, who dropped the bomb, and have thus already demonstrated our willingness to engage in atomic warfare, have told the world that we are willing and qualified to sit in a period of judgment upon it and the purity of its atomic intentions, and that, if we are satisfied after an indefinite period that the rest of the world is not planning to do what we have already done, then we ourselves will, at our own discretion, give up the right and power to make atomic warfare too. That is the essence of the bargain plan—that we will sit in judgment on the world until it meets our standard in atomic matters. But what if, in the meantime, we ourselves are being judged, by ourselves, in our own hearts? If there is a guilt growing upon us, there is only one way to expiate it. That is for us, as a people, to dedicate ourselves more consistently to peace than we have yet done, to act as decisively for a higher standard of world behavior as we acted decisively for a lower standard of world behavior at Hiroshima, to turn from our own fatalistic fascination with the ultimate material force which can destroy us to a wholehearted dedication to the only forces, which are moral and spiritual, which can save us. Not to judge, but to exemplify, is America's role.

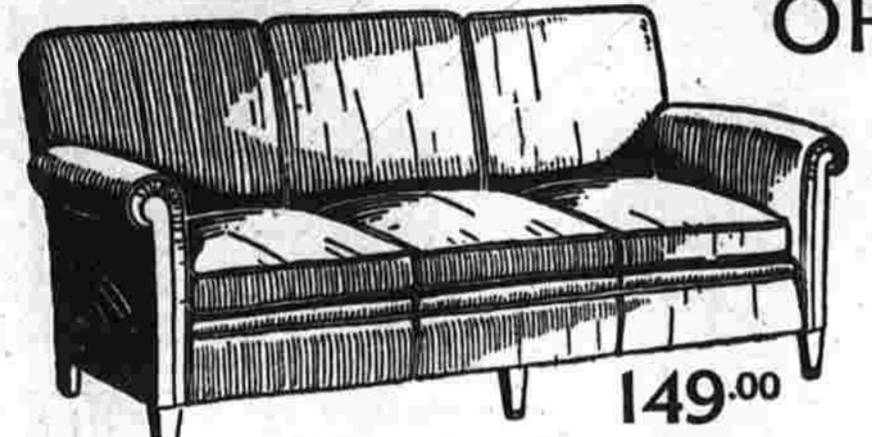

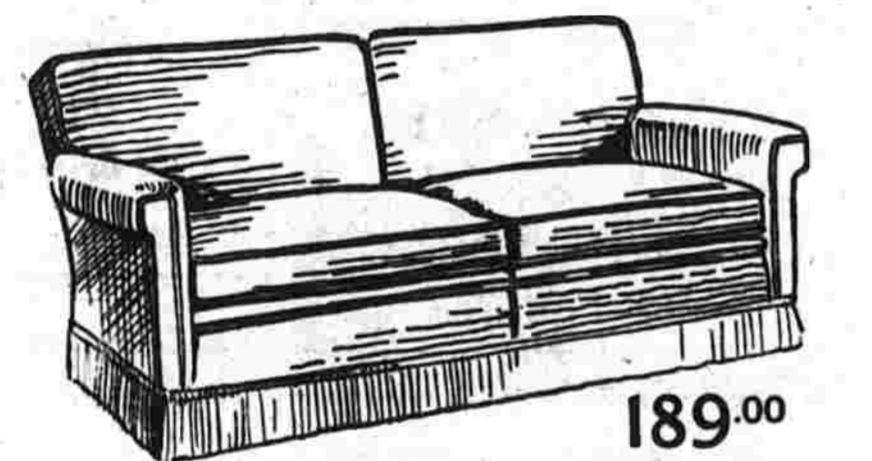

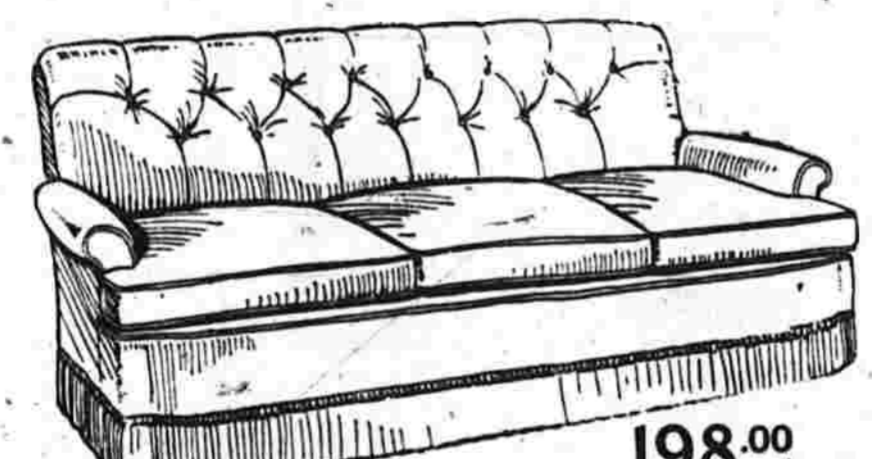
