called only with the most naked
political aim on the part of President
Truman—one must get on to the
fact that the Republicans, for
their part, cooperated all too well
with Mr. Truman in playing his
kind of politics.

Both parties think they have
gained political capital from this
conduct at the session.

The Democrats think that, by
highlighting the problems of inflation
and veterans' housing, and by
highlighting the Republicans' unwillingness
to do anything about these problems,
they have stored up votes for
themselves in November. They
are particularly hopeful of this
because of the present and new
high trend of the cost of living
should continue. They are
glad that, on the housing issue,
they revealed a split inside the
Republican party. They are
glad that, in general, they illustrated
that Old Guard Republicanism
and not Governor Dewey were in
charge of Congress. The fact
that Governor Dewey did not take
charge they discount as outside
the argument.

The Republicans, on the other
hand, took a defensive attitude in
the special session, and conceding
that they might possibly be yielding
some campaign arguments to the
Democrats, relied on two
pieces of strategy to blunt the
effectiveness of the Democratic
attack.

Their first strategy was to
swing the session into a Southern
Senator filibuster on the issue of
civil rights. This revealed the
Democratic party split again, and
it revealed Mr. Truman in much
the same relationship with certain
elements of his own party that
Governor Dewey suffers with
some elements of his party. If
Governor Dewey did not consider
the special session the right opportunity
for him to try to control
his own party in Congress,
President Truman tried that control
and failed in it.

The second piece of Republican
strategy was the scheduling of
the red scare hearings, in which
testimony long in the possession
of the FBI and the New York
federal grand jury which did
return the indictments against Communist
leaders was finally given
to the public. The frank object
of this was not to convict anybody.
The federal grand jury has
already issued the indictments it

object was to gain headlines
which would smother the Democratic
headlines of the session.

And, of course, if these headlines

Our latest happy step in the
direction of those habits of
thought and action which distinguish
the hysterically suspicious
ness of the Kremlin is the discovery,
by some minor officials
of our State Department, that
dangerous, un-American people
are getting into this country as
members of the staff and delegations
of the United Nations, which we
once invited to make its headquarters
in this country.

Secretary of State Marshall
first held himself about this
alarm, but then subsequently
honored it with the appointment
of a special committee to investigate
it. It appears that the national
safety can only be protected
if the United Nations which
was once supposed to create
a new kind of safety for all
nations, is driven from our shores.

And the inference is that Americans
can no longer stand having
strangers, or strange ideas, in
their own midst. The inference
is that we must close ourselves
off completely from the outside
world, and insulate ourselves
against all outside
ideas. And there is a further
inference that we Americans
had better be pretty careful about
talking to foreigners, or to people
who may have relatives in foreign
countries.

There is only one other country
in the world today which is capable
of harboring such a state of
mind. That country is Russia. To
be sure, Russia has something
of a reputation for the most naked
political aim on the part of
President Truman—one must get on
to the fact that the Republicans,
for their part, cooperated all too
well with Mr. Truman in playing
his kind of politics.

Both parties think they have
gained political capital from this
conduct at the session.
