

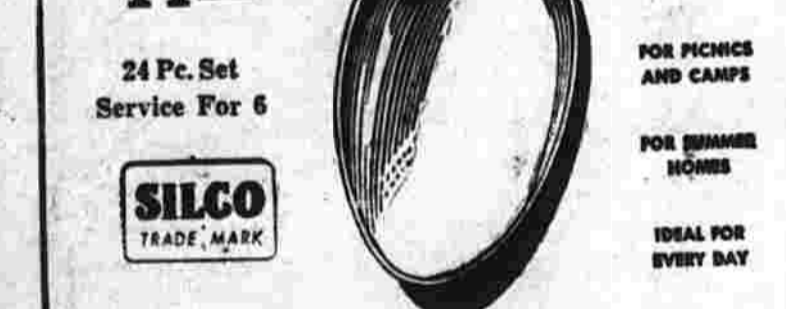

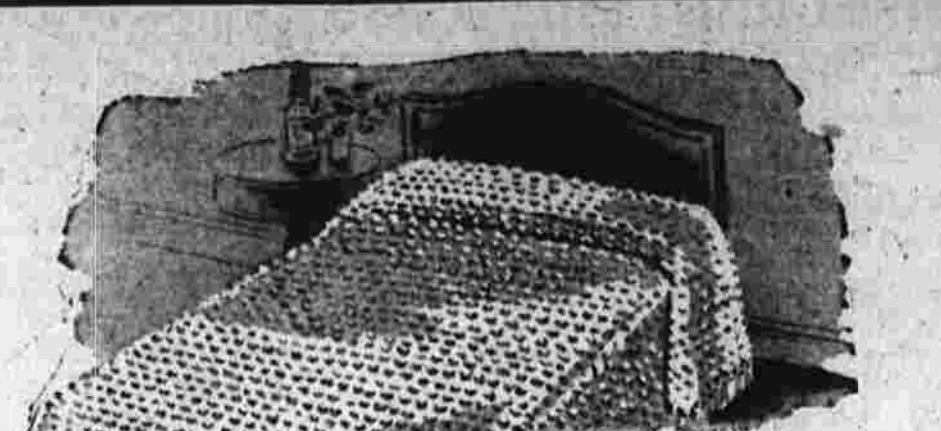

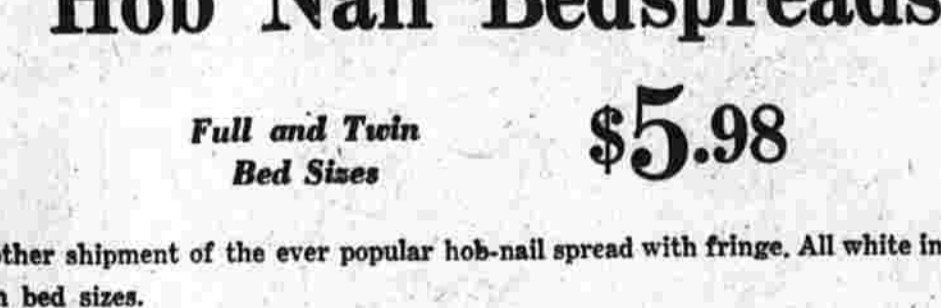

Try to Find West Coast Oil Sources

Three Companies Are Using Man-Made Earthquakes to Create Sea Bottom Shocks

Santa Barbara, Calif., Aug. 18.—(AP)—Three oil companies are engaged in an exciting gamble off the Santa Barbara coast, using man-made earthquakes in an effort to find vast new sources of petroleum for fuel-hungry America.

Dull reverberations of a potent new explosive called EP-15 (nitrotriazole) create shock waves as deep as 15,000 feet below the ocean bottom. Never before has it been used to pump oil from rock cavities underlying the open sea itself.

A Proposed Code The Issue... We are quite sure that the issue involved in the criticism by the Board of Directors of the services Town Plan Commission is not a personal issue in any sense. We are not sure that it is a legal issue, although it may be. The displacement of Mr. Griswold, or his retention in his place, are relatively unimportant, except in that the decision of his case may be a symbol. We are sure that Mr. Griswold is himself without guilt or guilt in the situation. He accepted a town position while he was engaged in a certain private enterprise system of earning his own living, and he has quite naturally, continued that personal enterprise, in the course of which he has been preparing plans affecting the future of Manchester, plans which come for approval before the town board of which he is a member. If that is a crime, he should have been told that it would be such before he was asked to accept his public position. He was not, and yet now he is told that there is an issue in his service. What is that issue? It is, first, an issue which does not concern the case of Mr. Griswold alone. If any principle is established in his case, it will have to be applied in other cases. If a new standard of public service is erected to govern the conduct on the Town Plan Commission, that same standard will have to be applied to all of those who serve the town in one official capacity or another. What is the new standard which is being proposed, by indirection, in the case of Mr. Griswold? It is, to state it simply, that no town official should, regardless of his excellence of character and good conscience of judgment, be allowed to occupy a position in which he has the responsibility for deciding a potential or even a suggested conflict between his own personal interests and those of the town and its citizens. Such an ideal state of affairs is going to be difficult to achieve and to maintain. It will not be obtained by headline criticism, or maintained by compulsion of any kind. It cannot be enforced, for there is not always any question of legality involved. It can only be obtained, we think, through a tacit spread and acceptance of an informal code, in which those who are serving the town now and those who enter the service of the town in the future will automatically honor the principle involved. We, for our part, have no desire to list those officials who may be in transgression of this not yet recognized code. If we had retro-active power, we would take the name of Mr. Griswold out of it too. What we do hope is that all those involved will quietly and gradually adjust themselves to the suggested code. We think that code - that no town official should be called upon to act for the town on a problem in which his personal interests, aside from the routine personal interests of any taxpayer, are involved - is an integral part of the spirit of the new town charter.
