Captured Russians Willing to Be Spies

Nuernberg, Germany, Aug. 26— (P)—Before the Stalingrad campaign, captured Russians were willing to work for the Germans as spice against their cure people on spies against their own people, an American war crimes court was American war crimes court was told today.

After the debacle of Gen. Friedrich von Paulus' Sixth German Army, the turning point in the eastern war, the Soviet prisoners changed their attitude and stubbornly refused such assignments, the court was told.

This was brought out in a trial brief submitted by Alexandre G. Hardy, against Walter Schellenberg, former confidant of Gestapo Chieftain Henrich Himmler.


