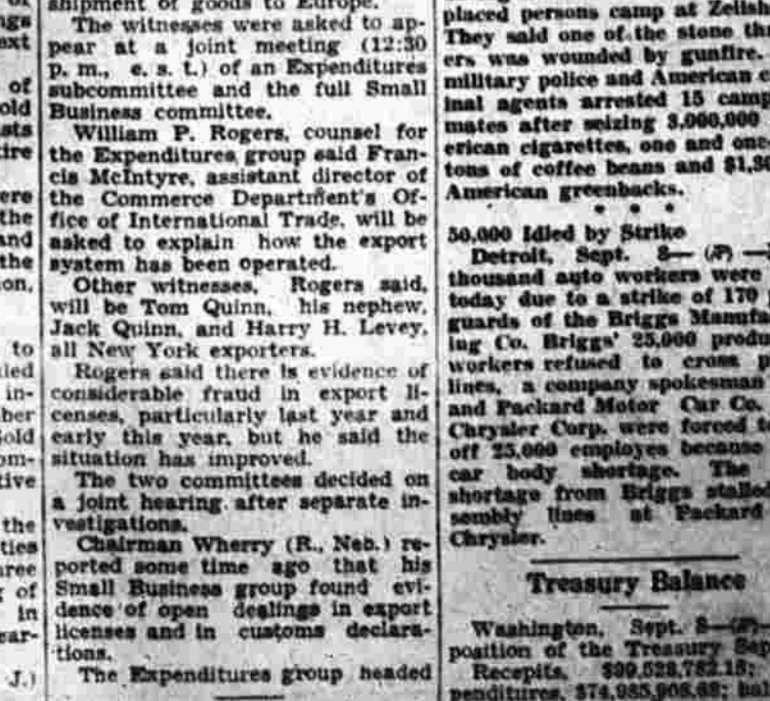

Doctor in Malta Is Interested in the 40 Hour Week Roster

An interesting letter has been received by William P. Glover, superintendent of Manchester Memorial hospital, from Dr. Edgar Bonnici, medical superintendent of a small government hospital of 300 beds, the St. Vincent De Paul Hospital of Malta, G. C., in the Mediterranean.

Dr. Bonnici states he has read with interest Mr. Glover's article "Personal Management" in the June issue of the "American Practitioner", from which he gathers that hospitals in America are confronting Malta, regarding hospital personnel.

The article was first presented by Mr. Glover before the Hospital Standards Conference, American College of Surgeons, in New York, September 11, 1947, the report appearing in the magazine.

Dr. Bonnici requested information regarding working time of Manchester Memorial personnel and was particularly interested in obtaining a copy of the contemplated 40-hour week roster. He wrote a 56-hour week in effect in Malta and included with his letter a roster of duties for mid-

Need Is Seen For Training

State Veterans Advisory Group Urges Promotion of Programs

Hartford, Sept. 8.—(AP)—With about 10,000 veterans unemployed, the State Veterans Advisory Commission sees the "need" for vigorous promotion of G. I. training programs.

Additional promotion will also become necessary during the present fiscal year, the commission said Governor Shannon in its annual report today, because of the "possibility that peak employment is at least some areas will decline."

"Connecticut's greatest asset as an industrial state is its skilled workers," the report said. "Every additional training program that can be started before the July, 1951, deadline will benefit the future economy of the state."

The commission noted that it had been busy during the past year serving as a "clearing house" for all agencies involved in obtaining and disseminating such information on training programs.

Meriden Man Crash Victim

Battered Body Found on Haddam Roadside Identified by Sister

Haddam, Sept. 8.—(AP)—State police at the Westbrook barracks announced today that the battered body of a hit-and-run victim found by the roadside here Monday had been identified as Adelard Fiset, 41, of 133 Wilcox avenue, Meriden.

Identification had been established by Fiset's sister, Mrs. Cecile Polak of Bridgeport. The description of the man's clothing published in the newspapers led Mrs. Polak to suspect that the dead man was her brother, Shaw said.

Fiset's body, the skull fractured and the abdomen torn open, was found by the roadside near the Haddam jail. The label of a Bridgeport store on the man's coat was the only clue to his identity.

Griswold Case Turned Over to Town Counsel

Directors in Executive Session Take Action to Clear Up Several Legal Points

The Board of Directors in executive session last night turned over to town counsel William S. Mahoney the Griswold case.

The board decided that before it took action on Griswold's motion it should clear up several legal points, and that the board should drop the case after the town counsel had advised it.

At one point a resolution was proposed by one member in referring the case to the town counsel. The board should do in the matter, but this course was dropped after the town counsel had advised it.

Director Richard Martin, while he maintained his belief in his own position, said that he should be in a position to do the work which he had done as a public official, said that he thought possibly if the board enacted a policy to that effect, such action would bring about Mr. Griswold's resignation, and the necessity to "fire" him might be avoided.

Mayor Cecil W. England stated that in his mind most of the objection to Griswold's service might be eliminated if Griswold disinterested himself in voting on matters in which he had shared preparation.

The decision of the board last night was to postpone the case until a date later this week when the legal aspects might have been cleared up.

As last night's public hearing on the Griswold case opened, Mayor England asked for a reading of the complaint against Griswold and asked if his resignation had been received. He was told that it had not.

Disappointed with the charge lodged against him, Griswold asked if first "what crime" he had committed and what regulations, if any, he had broken.

No Reflection on Man

Director Martin replied that there was no hint of a charge had indulged in any "crime"; that the charge in effect was no reflection on Griswold's integrity, and that it was his own choice to resign. He said that he was not concerned with the charge, but that he was concerned with the fact that he was being asked to resign from a position which he had held for so long.

Griswold replied that an engineer lives on his reputation, and that he considered that he was being made the object of personal attack by "the charge."

His Reason for Refusal

"I have refused to resign," he stated, "because such a course might be construed to mean I had taken an easy way out of a mess. Except for the result on my reputation I would resign, but I cannot do that now. My friends come to me and say 'Griswold, what have you done—that has happened to you'—that has happened to me. If I should resign, it would be taken that the public would say I have done something wrong."

Continuing, Griswold stated that the directors should "tell the people of Manchester what I have done that is wrong, what policy I have violated. If you make a public policy that I can't follow, I'll resign. But there is something more back of this. I think there is someone feeling involved and that someone has taken a shot at Alexander Jarvis and has hit me."

Griswold was referring to plans he had prepared for Jarvis, discussion on which came as a prelude to the move for his dismissal.

Griswold reviewed the circumstances of his appointment to office and of his service on the Commission.

He recalled that some years ago he had been an applicant for the post of town engineer, but had not secured this position. Soon afterward, he said, he was approached and asked if he would take an appointment as a member of the zoning group.

"I did not seek this appointment," he said, "and questioned whether it would interfere with my engineering work."

Had Made Position Clear

He pointed out that he had brought all of the details of his private activity before town officials then, and was assured that his private employment would not interfere with the discharge of his duties if he accepted appointment. Since then, he said, there has never been any question as to his score until "suddenly this came up."

Griswold went into detail in regard to the particular planning of the zoning group, and stated that he had, in the early days of his service, refrained from voting on plans he had prepared, but later, because he felt other board members might think he was not personally, he took to registering a vote. He said he felt the action placed him on record as being more responsible, and in "fully backing up what I had done."

Willing to Abstain From Voting

On questioning, he stated that he was perfectly willing to abstain from voting on plans he had prepared if that was desired.

Director Sherwood G. Bowers asked if Griswold considered that he had done the right thing in voting on such plans previously.

Permits Granted For Three Houses

Ernest Richardson, who last month was granted permission by Zoning Board of Appeals to erect three houses all slightly under plan.

After some further concluding remarks, the hearing was closed.

Former Circus Acrobat Describes Early Years

Henry Ferguson at 80 Looks Back to Time When He Delighted Audiences With Act

"I did acrobatics for a good many years, then went to the circus," he said.

Henry Ferguson, 80, of 4 Pearl street, summed up half a lifetime of show work. His remark that he "went to the dogs," however, should not be misinterpreted. Mr. Ferguson merely meant that he changed from an acrobatic act to a dog act in social or moral prestige.

A former acrobat and vaudeville man, Mr. Ferguson has travelled throughout the country with circus and burlesque shows. He has lived in Manchester about 16 years and has been retired since business 20 years. A small, wiry man with a fringe of straight white hair, the former acrobat is active for his 80 years. He still did work on the hoof when he decided that he was "getting too old."

A native of Massachusetts, Mr. Ferguson was born in 1868 in Newburyport, Mass. He started at 12 years of age, he first developed an interest in acrobatics and started touring with his parents. "Anybody who wanted to see a dog show from school" to practice on the bars and to pick up whatever money he could from the professionals.

He performed a bounding act. He finally got his wish and entered into show business as an acrobat. At the age of 20, he started traveling with shows doing horizontal bar and bounding acts on what is called a trampoline. A square netted frame, the trampoline is a device that looks something like a billiard table. Mr. Ferguson figured in acrobatic and aerial acts in vaudeville and circus for several years before he entered into a new comedy act that he conducted with two partners. In his capacity as an acrobat, Mr. Ferguson travelled all over the country with shows and vaudeville acts and was famous as the old Benjam and Bailey Bell and John Williams.

It was while performing in Mexico about 60 years ago that he got the idea for a show with dogs. He spent a great part of his career, Mr. Ferguson developed a well-known and humorous act that received high praise where he was shown. The former showman trained the acrobats and still has clippings and programs showing photographs and sketches used to advertise his act.

One old clipping, a bit dry and crumpled with the passage of the years, was taken from a Dubuque, Ia., newspaper and gives a short review of one of the parts of "Billion's" act.

"The scream of the day with the 'kiddies' was the Chaplin dog bit during the act of Million's dogs. The entire act, which the big feature is the Chaplin imitation done by one little canine in particular."

The clipping went on to say that the act "almost broke the show up in a riot." In this act, Mr. Ferguson fitted one of his fox terriers with a collar and a short time later, Mr. Ferguson set up a trampoline act in his back yard but after a time the rubber springs in the device lost

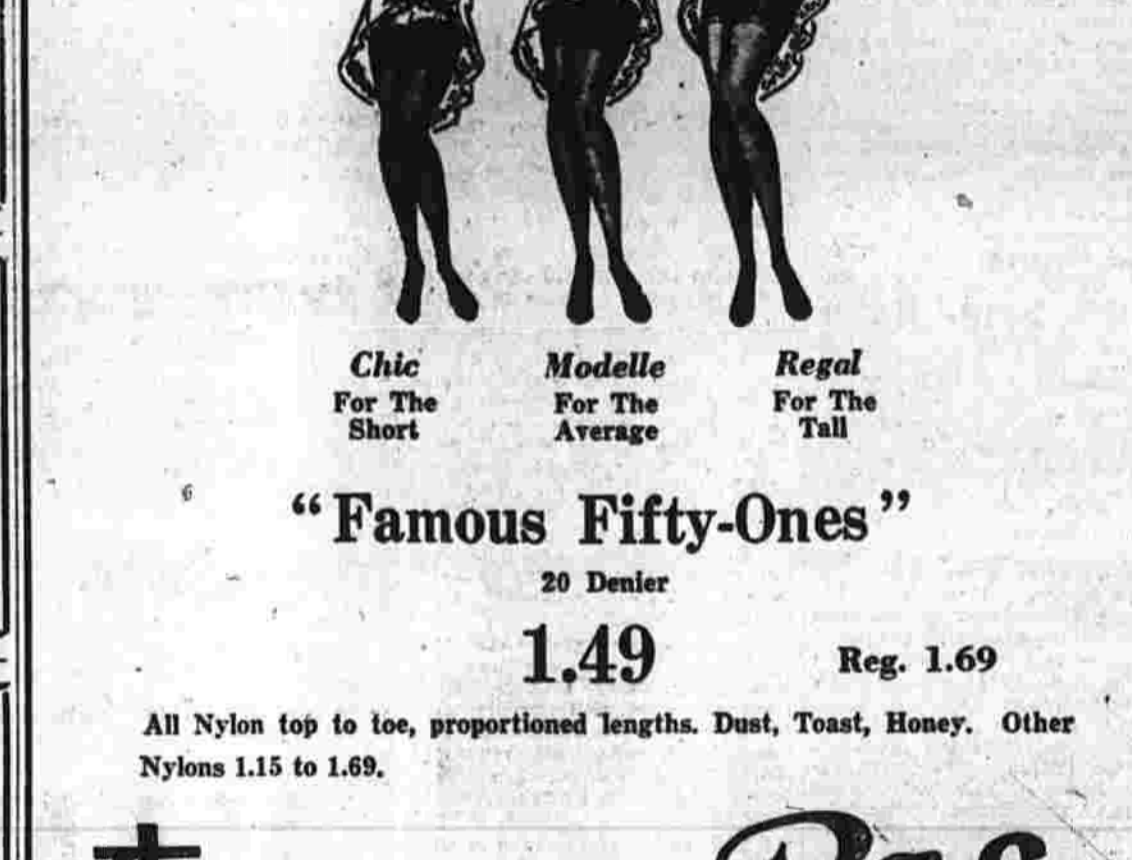

Poultry Stamp To Be Issued

New Haven Post Office Busy Preparing For Event Tomorrow

New Haven, Sept. 8.—(AP)—Because America's first poultry show was held in Boston in 1849, the staff of the New Haven post office, augmented by a couple of hundred extra hands, is up to its ears in work.

The stamp, bearing the legend "Centennial of the American Poultry Industry," shows a light Brahma rooster and, in the lower right hand corner, an egg on which is shown the stamp's denomination.

It is the first time the New Haven office ever had the task of making the first issue of a new stamp, and Postmaster Patrick J. Gode signed rather wistfully that "this is a lot more than I expected."

Two weeks collectors' orders for first covers have been pouring in. On labor day alone orders for 100,000 covers were processed, and Gode said the total probably would be half a million by Thursday when they will be mailed out.

Checks Aiding New Stamp

All over the post office, and overflowing the poultry centennial building offices such as the Bankruptcy court and Civil Service examining room checks are open orders and affixing the new stamp to the self-addressed envelopes sent in by the collector seeking the prized first day cancellations.

Cannot Halt Bank Thefts

Rapport Says It Is Impossible to Prevent People Stealing

Hartford, Sept. 7.—(AP)—State Bank Commissioner Richard Rapport says it is impossible to prevent people from stealing from banks.

But he adds that it is possible to make stealing more difficult and the detection of thieves easier, for which reason, he said today, he will ask the 1949 Legislature to require that bank audits be made annually by persons not employed in the banks.

Have Greatest Responsibility

The banks themselves have the greatest responsibility preventing embezzlement, Rapport says.

"It is not the function of the bank supervisory force, state or Federal, to catch crooks," he asserts. "Our function is to be that the law as it applies to the banks is observed, that their management and operating policies are sound."

Reporting to Gov. James C. Shannon today, Rapport said there is about \$3,000,000,000 on deposit in Connecticut banks and other banking institutions, and that the law is carried in "more accounts than there are people living in Connecticut."

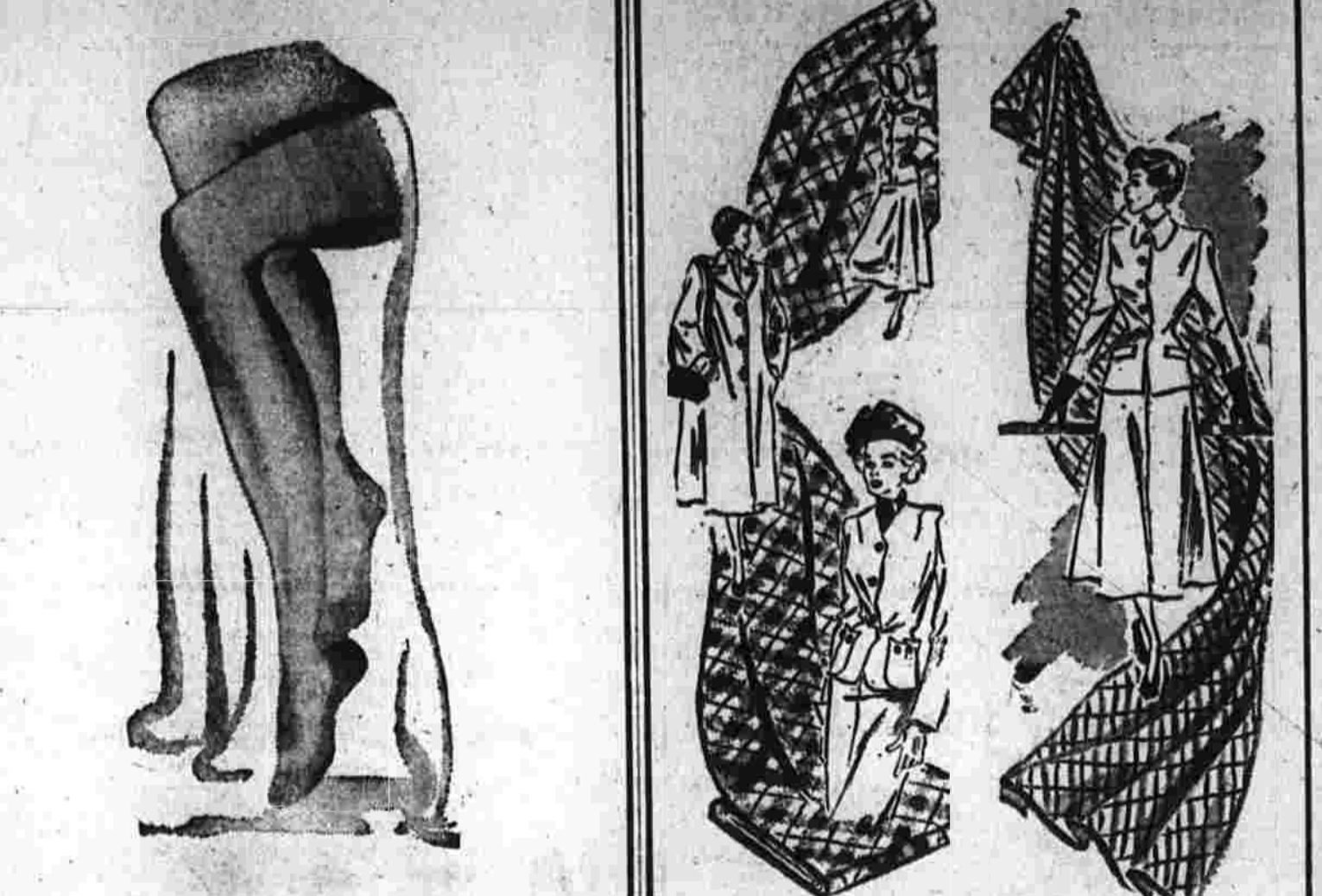
