Griswold replied that an engineer "lives on his reputation", and that he considered that he was being made the object of personal attack by "this commissions."

Except for the result on my reputation I would resign, but I can't do that now. My friends come to me and say "Griswold, what have you done—what has happened?". I feel that reflections have been cast on me wrongfully and that if I should resign, it would be taken that the public would say I have done something wrong."
