The Former Procedure

Under the former procedure in use here, eviction cases came before the local court. If it appeared that a tenant, liable to eviction, could not find any other place to live, the court granted a stay of execution, known as an "extension of time," usually a month or more, so that a family would not be moved into the street. There are some 60 such instances in Manchester today.

The legality of a local court issuing such extension of time was made for additional help.

Only a short time ago, there was talk of wiping out the Courts of Common Pleas due to lack of work for these courts. The opposite situation, now existing, may call for the naming of deputy judges who can function locally.

Attorneys here today were inclined to believe that the work of the Common Pleas Court in eviction matters will have to be spread out locally if the volume of business is to be handled at all.















