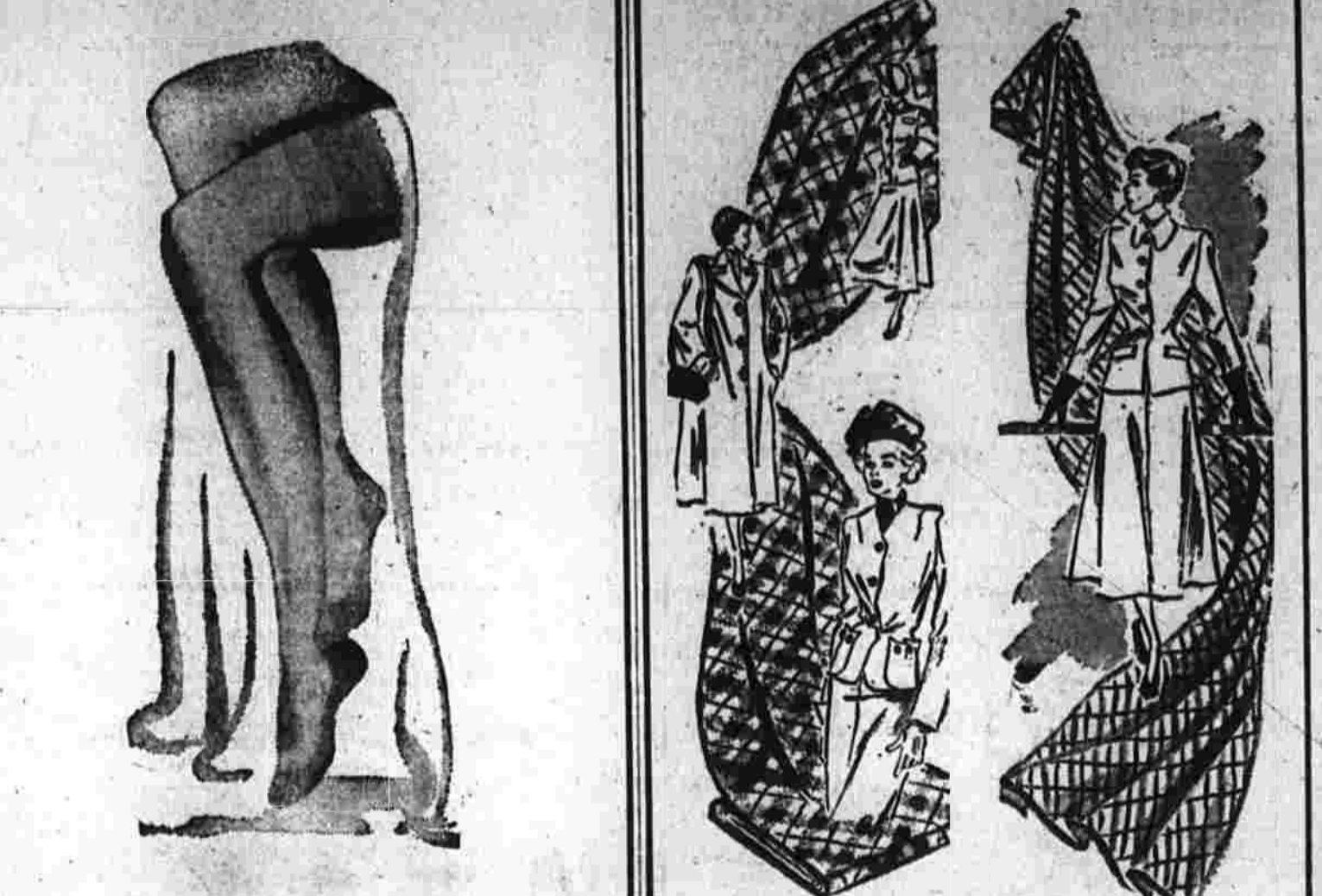

House Un-American Activities committee was pursuing its spy investigation behind closed doors today. Chairman J. Parnell Thomas (R-N.Y.) told reporters. The committee is continuing its investigation into the field of atomic espionage. It has held several public hearings and has received many suggestions from witnesses. The committee is expected to report its findings to the Senate in the near future.

Declines To Reveal Names of witnesses summoned to the closed door session and indicated that no announcement would be forthcoming before late afternoon. The committee claims that it has obtained some wartime shipments of uranium compounds and 25 pounds of refined metal from this country. It says it also has had testimony from a former intelligence officer that some atomic scientists leaked information to Soviet representatives. The House group is planning to resume public hearings next Wednesday when it may air some of the details. Representatives of the U. S. Atomic Energy Commission will be present. The hearing is expected to be held in the House chamber.

Long before the first trucks came from the American, British and French sectors fill with anti-Communist. The British had issued a permit for the rally but it ruled that after the first demonstrations must be at least a half mile from the Soviet border. This was a precaution against 'incidents'.

Russian fighter planes started to dive high above the American sector of Berlin today, leaving vapor trails reminiscent of the war days. The Russians broke no regulations, but excited the German population in this jittery four-power city.

The maneuvers, duly announced in advance, were staged against a Communist background of big power tension.

The Soviet commandant in Berlin, Maj. Gen. Alexander Kotliov, had just told the Americans 'not to interfere in matters which don't concern them.' This was the Russian answer to a protest by a German commandant.

Col. Frank Howley, against an invasion of American offices in the City hall Monday in which 15 western sector police were carried off.

The Russians also have turned down a French demand for the release of another 19 western sector police who were kidnapped by Soviet sector police Wednesday morning while traveling under a Russian safe-conduct guarantee.

Danish Territory Violated Danish Naval authorities in Copenhagen reported that at least 30 Soviet planes violated Danish territory today in flights of Bornholm island in the Baltic. They said one group had been seen flying over the island in the spring of 1945 and remained 10 months, withdrawing in 1946 after Danish protests.

Naval authorities expressed the opinion the Russian planes had come from bases in Germany. They said 12 craft passed over Bornholm, the island's main city, on them at an altitude only slightly over 300 feet.

Big. Gen. Jean Gansval, the French commandant in Berlin, accused Kotliov of being untruthful and breaker of pledges. In strong language, Gansval brought the Russians to task for bringing the guarantee of free passage they had given the western sector police.

Eviction Law to Hit Sixty Families Here

If they do not act at once they may lose rented quarters, Judge Bowers warns.

Over 60 families in Manchester have got to face immediate action if they wish to hold onto their rented homes, it was announced today by Judge Raymond R. Bowers of the Town Court. Due to the provision of the new eviction law, passed by the special session of the state legislature, a revision of procedure is effective in all cases where there has been granted an extension of time in connection with the action of the town court.

Persons here, to whom the Town Court has granted a temporary period in which they may seek other quarters before eviction becomes final, must, under the new law, go to the Hartford County Court of Common Pleas to get such extensions confirmed. If they do not do so by the deadline set at September 15, they will be liable to immediate eviction.

It was stated that today there are applications pending in for stays from all Hartford county towns. Twelve cases have been scheduled for hearing today, but due to the involved circumstances of the cases, they are being considered doubtful by this spokesman.

Today Bowers has sent out personal letters to all who are now living in the shadow of eviction in cases where they have been granted an extension of time. He stated that they will notify their clients of the drastic legal change.

The former procedure under the former law was that of writ of possession of the local court. If it appeared that the court was unable to execute, could not find any other place to live, the court granted a stay of execution, known as an "extension of time," usually a month or more, so that a family could move out of the street. There are some 60 such instances in Manchester.

The legality of a local court issuing such extension of time was questioned by the higher courts and the problem grew to such proportions that it was made a matter for the state action.

At the session just completed a new law changing the procedure in such cases was passed by the Court of Common Pleas in Hartford.

But, in addition, the law provides that all existing time extensions will be void after September 15 unless those now living under such locally-granted time extensions go to the Court of Common Pleas and get a new time extension. If action is not taken by September 15, the pending execution becomes effective.

The following is a letter sent out by Judge Bowers:

"You are Defendant in an eviction action which is pending in the Town Court of Manchester, and according to the law, you are not represented by an Attorney.

"The Special Session of the Legislature, which was held in August, passed a new law regarding evictions which gives to the Court of Common Pleas the exclusive power to give extensions of time to the tenants in eviction cases.

"The Town Court of Manchester can no longer give the tenant an extension of time and the extensions already granted expire on September 15th, according to the new law.

"The Court of Common Pleas is located on the third floor of the County Building, 200 Washington street, Hartford, Connecticut. If you have an extension of time from the local court, and if you are unable to find other living accommodations, and desire an extension beyond September 15th, you should go to the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas before September 15th and apply for a further extension. You can do this in person, without an Attorney, or you can have an Attorney do it for you.

"Not enough publicity has been given to this law, it is feared, have not been sufficiently publicized, and town officials are concerned that persons affected

Eviction Law to Hit Sixty Families Here

If they do not act at once they may lose rented quarters, Judge Bowers warns.

Over 60 families in Manchester have got to face immediate action if they wish to hold onto their rented homes, it was announced today by Judge Raymond R. Bowers of the Town Court. Due to the provision of the new eviction law, passed by the special session of the state legislature, a revision of procedure is effective in all cases where there has been granted an extension of time in connection with the action of the town court.

Persons here, to whom the Town Court has granted a temporary period in which they may seek other quarters before eviction becomes final, must, under the new law, go to the Hartford County Court of Common Pleas to get such extensions confirmed. If they do not do so by the deadline set at September 15, they will be liable to immediate eviction.

It was stated that today there are applications pending in for stays from all Hartford county towns. Twelve cases have been scheduled for hearing today, but due to the involved circumstances of the cases, they are being considered doubtful by this spokesman.

Today Bowers has sent out personal letters to all who are now living in the shadow of eviction in cases where they have been granted an extension of time. He stated that they will notify their clients of the drastic legal change.

The former procedure under the former law was that of writ of possession of the local court. If it appeared that the court was unable to execute, could not find any other place to live, the court granted a stay of execution, known as an "extension of time," usually a month or more, so that a family could move out of the street. There are some 60 such instances in Manchester.

The legality of a local court issuing such extension of time was questioned by the higher courts and the problem grew to such proportions that it was made a matter for the state action.

At the session just completed a new law changing the procedure in such cases was passed by the Court of Common Pleas in Hartford.

But, in addition, the law provides that all existing time extensions will be void after September 15 unless those now living under such locally-granted time extensions go to the Court of Common Pleas and get a new time extension. If action is not taken by September 15, the pending execution becomes effective.

The following is a letter sent out by Judge Bowers:

"You are Defendant in an eviction action which is pending in the Town Court of Manchester, and according to the law, you are not represented by an Attorney.

"The Special Session of the Legislature, which was held in August, passed a new law regarding evictions which gives to the Court of Common Pleas the exclusive power to give extensions of time to the tenants in eviction cases.

"The Town Court of Manchester can no longer give the tenant an extension of time and the extensions already granted expire on September 15th, according to the new law.

"The Court of Common Pleas is located on the third floor of the County Building, 200 Washington street, Hartford, Connecticut. If you have an extension of time from the local court, and if you are unable to find other living accommodations, and desire an extension beyond September 15th, you should go to the Clerk of the Court of Common Pleas before September 15th and apply for a further extension. You can do this in person, without an Attorney, or you can have an Attorney do it for you.
