Americans Trying Kin of Bismarck

Frankfurt, Germany, Sept. 10. -(A)-A great-grandson of Otto von Bismarck goes to trial today cefore an American Military ourt. He is Count Heinrich von Cinsiedel, 26, accused of being the Communists' "contact man"

in western Germany.

The Army charges that Einsiedel, a former Nazi Luftwaffe pilot who was captured by the Russians at Stalingrad, "contacted several individuals who are under suspicion and others known to be working against the occupation forces" when he was in the U.
