Nomination of Governor Is by Acclamation But Roll Call Vote Taken For His Running Mate; Defeats L. Governor Robert E. Parsons Who Concedes Alcorn's Election Before Vote Ends

Hartford, Sept. 14.—(AP)—Connecticut Republicans gave the gubernatorial nomination today to Governor James C. Shannon by acclamation and a roll call of the State's Assembly means at Hartford county as his running mate.

Alcorn, who got his early training and politics as State Representative, was the nomination for lieutenant governor in the only state convention called. He defeated Lieutenant Governor Robert E. Parsons.

Parsons conceded Alcorn's nomination before the convention closed but completed the roll call. When it became apparent that his rival could not be overhauled, Parsons came to the platform and moved that Alcorn's nomination be made unanimous. Alcorn then received the official vote of 395 to 48.

The roll call of the 618 delegates was a little more than half over when Parsons conceded defeat. The bulk of Parsons' vote came from his home district of Farmington.

Alcorn today passed a majority of the 618 delegates. Parsons came to the platform and conceded defeat. Parsons' vote was 48 to 395.

Alcorn's Acceptance Parsons then moved that Alcorn be nominated by acclamation. In a brief acceptance speech, Alcorn said: "You have nominated me for a high public office. I am deeply grateful for your trust in me. With sincere humility I accept this nomination and the grave responsibility which goes with it. The honor of serving the party and the state is equalled by another—the honor of becoming the running mate of our distinguished and beloved governor, Jim Shannon. To him, as to you, I pledge my unqualified loyalty and my unceasing labor in our common purpose and mission—a significant victory over the forces which would undermine our American way of life and make this great nation a land of rationed opportunity and rationed liberty."

The convention speedily proceeded to fill out the rest of the ticket with incumbent Republican officials.

Mrs. Frances R. Redick was nominated as secretary of the party.

A Small Bouquet
 Judge William S. Hyde is in a
 Boston hospital for what every one
 hopes will prove merely to be an
 observation. There is no reason to
 think that this community's formal
 assessment of his life in its
 midst need be undertaken for
 many years to come. What follows
 is just a small, community
 bouquet, given, as the occasion
 always be the case, to the living.

A good many people, we
 imagine, have been waiting over
 the years for such an opportunity
 to tell Bill Hyde what they think
 of him. Countless Manchester
 people feel that they owe him
 some debt of thoughtfulness and
 gratitude.

Bill Hyde is supposed to be the
 "boss" of Manchester. If he is
 that, it is an understanding which
 was created through no normal
 political pursuit of his own, but
 which has arisen, over the years,
 because he has been exceptionally
 willing to give of his time and his
 courtesy to others.

Bill Hyde, as a part of his po-
 sition, holds certain honors and
 certain posts, which might nor-
 mally be regarded as the reward
 of political activity and prestige.
 Every one in Manchester knows
 Bill Hyde has always given much
 more than he has taken and kept.

There is no one in Manchester
 who, so far as Bill Hyde is con-
 cerned, is not his real or potential
 friend. There is a reverse side of
 that coin, and it is about time he
 were asked to look at it.

India Forgets Gandhi
 That same India which lives as
 the creation of Mohandas K.
 Gandhi, who repeatedly defied
 force as a solution of human prob-
 lems, and who, by that method,
 achieved the impossible, has em-
 barked upon the use of force.
 It thinks it has a just cause. It
 considers it to be an intolerable
 situation that the Moslem ruler of
 the state of Hyderabad should re-
 fuse to bring his state, which is
 predominantly Hindu in popula-
 tion, into the Hindu dominion of
 India. It proclaims that its own
 ambition is merely to free the
 people of that state from their
 ruler's refusal to grant them their
 own free decision. So, as use of
 force has gone through human
 history, the leaders of India can
 claim a comparative justification
 for their acts.

We don't think there were any
 gradations in Gandhi's aversion to
 the use of force. If there were,
 they were probably in a direction
 opposite to that of normal human
 thinking. We suspect that the
 more right he felt himself to be,
 the more fervently he believed
 that force must not be touched.
 He had no dramatic choice of the
 moment in which his own life was
 to be given. But it so happened
 that it was given as he was stat-
 ing all his prestige and influence
 on an appeal to the people of India
 to refrain from the force temp-
 tations of a complicated and pain-
 ful situation involved in the par-
 tition of India.

He fell from the bullet of one of
 his own Hindus who resented his
 preaching against force. Now
 the Hindu state of India is fol-
 lowing the formula of the assas-
 sin, not that of Gandhi.

India, in its way, like France in
 its way, mirrors the world.
 India we have the still warm her-
 itage of the greatest and wisest
 man of our times, a map who
 made a lifetime's pursuit of pen-
 etrating to the eternal truths by
 which decent men should live, and
 then of putting these truths into
 practice.

And, against that spiritual her-
 itage, we have the more normal
 instincts of less thoughtful human
 beings, the instincts which think

Real Remedy Also Cheaper

Parking meters achieve a temporary alleviation of any community's parking problems by enforcing a more equitable distribution of the use of existing parking facilities. They make it somewhat easier for the police to enforce parking regulations. There is little doubt that the additional man required to service and patrol the meters could bring about such good enforcement without the meters. But meters are the fashionable thing, in this age of increasing regimentation of the details of living, and although they may be fashionable enough they do not perform any basic cure of the problem they are treating. They treat the symptom, not the disease.

The treatment of the disease itself requires not a quackish effort to divide a limited amount of parking space among an ever increasing number of would-be users, but the provision of more space. To this basic remedy, all communities are going to have to add themselves in parking meters first. Middletown, as we noted the other day, is an ex-

ample. A sensible community, then, might try the basic cure first. In fact, it would be sure to, were it not for the lure of indirect taxation, as opposed to direct taxation, which is the real reason for the chase and establish municipal parking lots. That money would come directly out of taxes. People do not like to pay taxes, and officials do not like to levy them.

Parking meters, on the other hand, are installed "free" by a benevolent company which charges the town nothing for the technical arrangement. Once they are set up, the parking meters begin tapping the Manchester purse. And after they are paid for themselves, they begin rolling money into the town treasury. But this tax they collect is not the town tax rate; it is indirect, not direct, taxation. Furthermore, it is not collected as a dollar once a year, but as pennies from day to day. All these circumstances make possible the fiction that it doesn't cost a community anything to have parking meters.

Yet the truth is that parking meters, over the years, cost more money than would ever be involved in the provision of municipal parking lots, and keep on costing it forever.

So far as the community's purse is concerned, parking meters are the most expensive way of dealing with the parking problem. So far as the official budget is concerned, they appear to be the cheapest, because they cost that budget and its tax rate nothing, and, indeed, provide pleasant revenue for that budget. But this is not direct, taxation, and the bookkeeping and not fact. A community has one pocket, and it makes no difference whether the agency reaching in it is the tax collector or the sidewalk bandit, except that, in the case of the sidewalk bandit, a continuing proportion of the intake goes out of town.

So, if a community looks honestly at the question of which remedy, the basic remedy, or the partial quick remedy, is the more economical, it is actually the basic remedy, the provision of more parking space, which recommends itself. It is not only the remedy which should be tried first. It is the remedy which costs less.

American Pilots Drop in Red Zone

Frankfurt, Germany, Sept. 14—(AP)—Two American air lift pilots bailed out over the Soviet zone early this morning and have not been heard from since.

Air Force headquarters said they were ferrying a C-47, laden with food, from Wiesbaden to Berlin, when the pilot radioed at 4:30 a. m. that both engines had failed and the ship was losing altitude.

The message said the crew was abandoning ship in the vicinity of Langensala, about 20 miles inside the Russian zone. It said one motor had cut out and the other had begun to quit.

German police at Langensala said they had heard nothing about the accident, but would investigate.

Nine Americans have died in five fatal crashes since the air lift over the Soviet blockade of Berlin began in June.

An American search team today to seek the two fliers.

The U. S. Air Force said American army officers along the U. S. Russian border had notified Soviet authorities about the accident.

Air Force officials at Wiesbaden said the report had been given to Russian members of the four-power air safety control board in Berlin.

"We believe the Russians will do everything they can to help," one Air Force spokesman said. "Names of the two airmen are being withheld for the time being."
