#### Large Proportion of Voters Stay Away from Polls on Primary Day

In the primary here Tuesday a check of voting figures today shows that about four times as many members of both parties kept away from the polls as cast votes. The proportion of voters who did not vote was not as great in the primary as it has been in some elections where the stay-away vote was independent of party affiliation.

In the primary the figures, as compiled by the registrars, show the following: Republican vote, 2,690; Democratic vote, 2,053 did not vote, 2,615 total voters, 500 voted and 2,115 did not. District 1, 1,963 voters, 305 voted and 1,658 did not. District 2, 2,111 total voters, 533 voted and 1,578 did not. District 3, 1,307 voters, 249 voted and 1,058 did not.

### Italy Recovering Thanks to ERP

Benefits from the European recovery program have begun to show in Italy's budget, Giuseppe Pella, treasury minister, said today.

Pella told the lower chamber Italy's budget deficit had receded from 711,000,000,000 lire (\$1,200,000,000) in 1947 to 374,000,000,000 lire (\$625,000,000) in 1948.

The minister said the reduction of the deficit was partly due to ERP aid, and partly to progressive reduction of government controlled prices on food.

Pella said: "After having witnessed the tremendous increase in Italy's national budget deficit from 1943-44 to 1947-48 for the first time we see the curve in its descending phase."

A more severe trend in the downward "search," Pella said, "could determine economic and social troubles."

Of the 347,000,000,000 lire deficit reduction, Pella said, "211,000,000,000 lire were to be credited to the reduction of government controlled food prices, and so indirectly to American aid."

### American Ships Not Fired Upon

Tokyo, Sept. 16—(AP)—Flares dropped over the liberty ship Moses Brown by two unidentified planes resulted today in an erroneous report that the Russian-Chinese vessel had been fired on.

Capt. Kenneth D. Fryc, skipper of the 1,716-ton freighter, reported the ship's operators, the Shepard lines, that the flares were dropped Saturday night in the Sea of Japan, off Russia's Siberian coast.

Because the Moses Brown is owned by the U. S. Maritime commission and is registered in the United States, copies of the message relayed from San Francisco to the commission and to the Company's New York office.

(In Washington, the Maritime commission said it received the report from the Shepard lines, Boston office and that it mentioned "an explosion 100 feet above the vessel," but that it wasn't clear whether it was a star shell or parachute flare.

(Anyhow, the commission relayed the report to the state department, which said it had a report the Moses Brown was fired upon, but that the department had no details.)

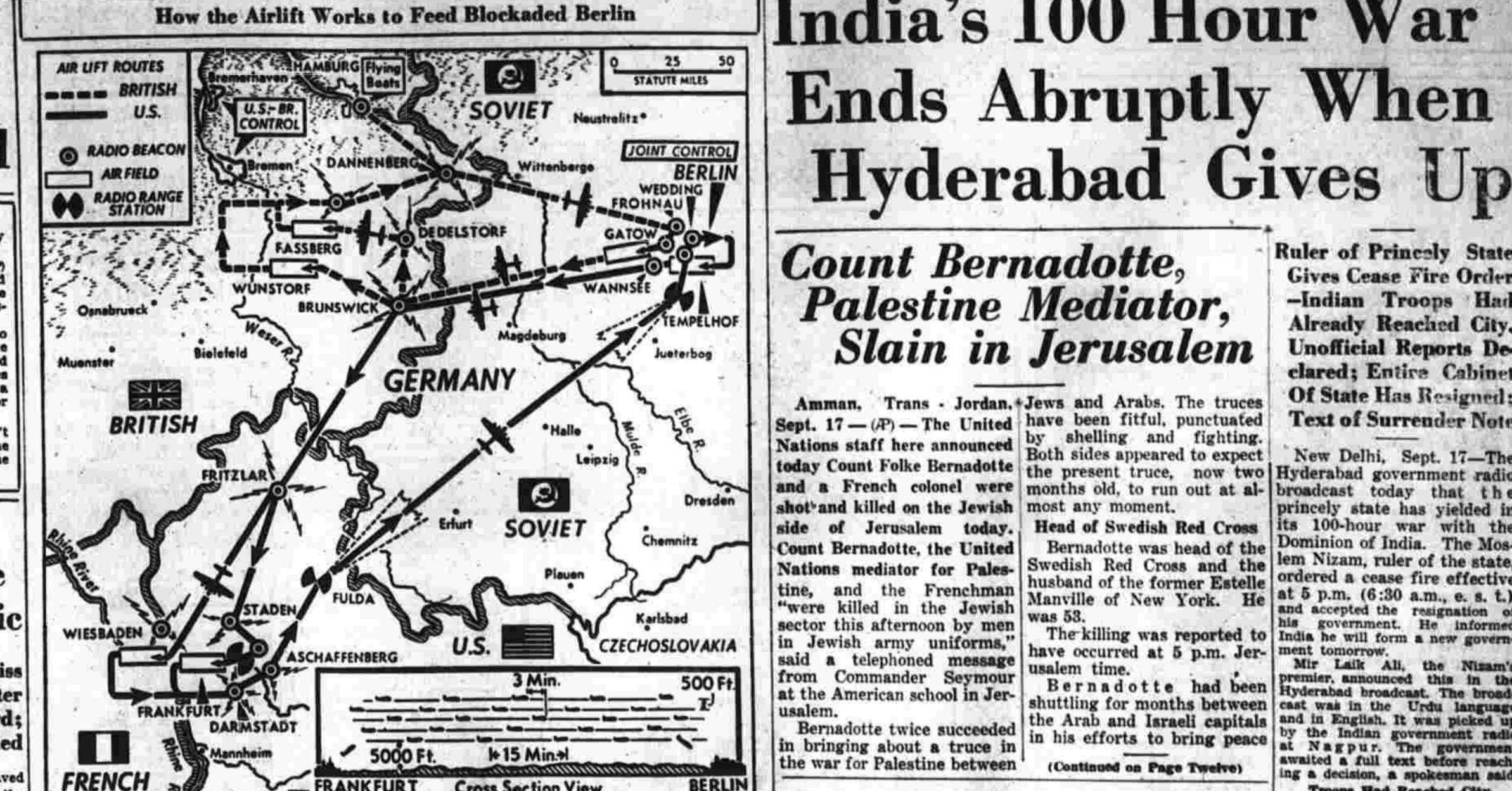
