Hartford, Sept. 21-(P)- Manufacturing employment in Connecticut has dropped, while non-manufacturing employment "pursued steady upward course" during the year, the State Labor department reported today.

Workers employed in the state's factories in August totaled 392,-050, as against 393,330 in July, and 406,000 for August, 1947, the abor department reported. Employed workers in non-manufacturing industries, trades and services for August totaled 368,-

200, as compared with 367,700 for July and 358,690 for August of non-agricultural workers for August of this year was 760,250, as against 764,690 for August 1947.
"The entire drop in employment during the year," the department states.
