Truman Urges Voters Retain Him in Office

Seeks to Hang 'Me, Too' Tag on Republican Promises to Develop Great River Valleys

Aboard Truman Campaign Train Sept. 25—(AP)—President Truman sought today to hang a "me, too" tag on Republican promises to develop the great river valleys and to southwest-river voters "it's safer" to elect the Democrat.

Mr. Truman carried his fighting campaign from Arizona to New Mexico and Texas with the claim that the G. O. P. wants to "move the capital from Washington back to Wall street."

His audience to cheer at Phoenix to cheer and applause last night when he said that the Davis dam and transmission lines will be completed on schedule in 1952 "if we can keep the Republicans from throwing more money wrenches into the machinery."

The G. O. P., Mr. Truman continued, is saving up a "lot of special interest money" to be used in the next Congress to protect the people's interests and to departures from a prepared manuscript: "God help the country if that happens."

Mr. Truman rolled today through Phoenix at 11:30 a. m. (e. s. t.) on route to El Paso, Texas, where he will arrive at 10:30 a. m. (e. s. t.) for a speaking engagement.
