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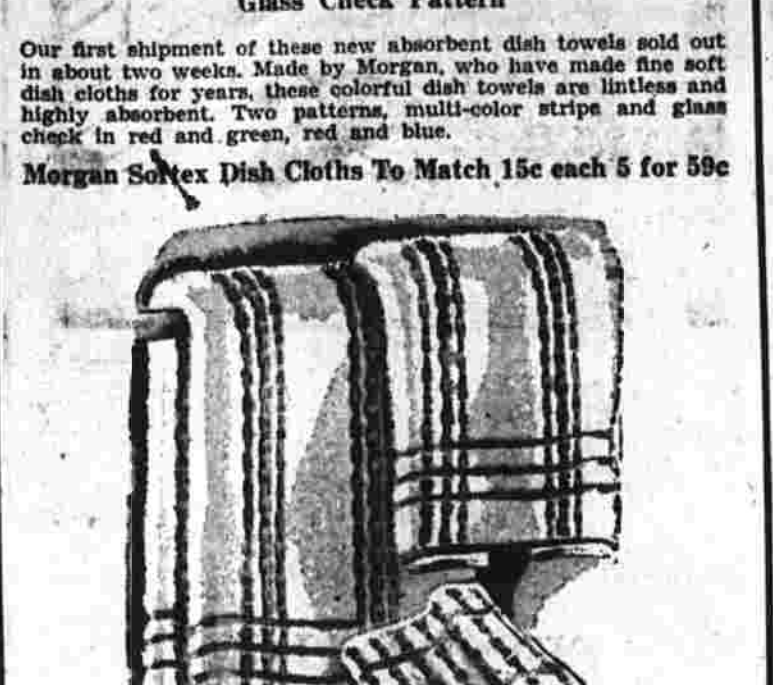
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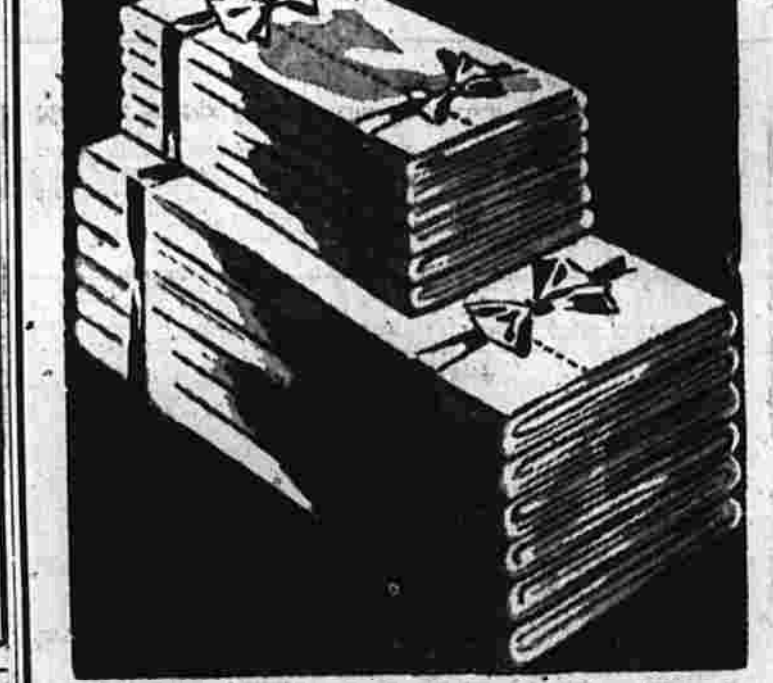

When Russia proposes anything which, on the surface, seems for the good of the world, the answer of the West is automatic. The Russian proposal is more propaganda. It is something to be greeted with derision. The proposal itself is something to be avoided, as a plague.

Now a part of this reaction is certainly justified and authentic. Russia is no paragon of virtue. Russia is not disturbed by problems of good and evil. Russia is not really thinking of what is good for the world, but of what is good for Russia. So when Russia now and then parades her oratorical virtue, that is propaganda.

Whether such propaganda should be automatically derided, or whether such proposals in themselves should be always avoided, is another question.

It bothers us, as an American, that it is Russia who has been left free to make propaganda use of the things men want, of the things which would be good for the world.

It bothers us that Russia is continually proposing the evacuation of all allied troops from Germany, and that the West never proposes such a thing. Because that is something which has to happen sooner or later. It bothers us that Russia alone is calling for the conclusion of a peace treaty for Germany, and that we do nothing but shut ourselves out of the end of the war, it has been Russia alone which has made proposals for general world disarmament, while the West has proposed only atomic disarmament. For general disarmament, too, is something which has to happen if the world is to survive.

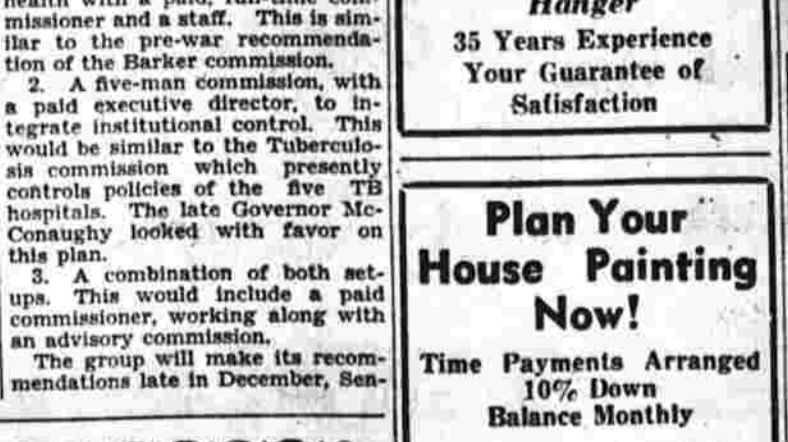
