Washington, Oct. 22—(P) — Uncle Sam's parcel post system has enjoyed a small time bonanza this year. Both the parcels it handled and the revenue it collected increased markedly.

Post office men lay this in large part to the fact that the Railway Express agency increased its rates last January. They point out that the post office plans to increase its rates also next January.

Here's how the parcel post system jumped its business this year. In the 12 months ending last June the system handled 6,085,000,000 pounds of parcels. In the 12 preceding months it handled 4,958,600,000 pounds. That was an increase of 22.7 per cent in a year. In August this year revenue had jumped 26.4 per cent over August, 1947. It was \$19,965,000 this year. Last year it was \$15,796,000.

When any vehicle shall be parked in any parking meter space adjacent to which a parking meter is located, the operator of such vehicle shall park it within the lines or marks established. excepting any vehicle whose length, width or load overlaps the said lines or marks, and upon entering said parking meter space, imme-diately deposit or cause to be deposited in said parking meter such proper coin of the United States as is required by the traffic authority for such parking meter and as is designated by direction on the meter. When required by direction on the meter, the operator of said vehicle after the deposit of the proper coin shall also completely turn or cause to be turned the crank handle on said parking meter for the purpose of starting the timing mechanism. Failure to deposit such proper coin and to turn the crank handle when so required shall constitute a viola-tion of this ordinance. Upon the deposit of such proper coin, and tion of this ordinance. Upon the deposit of such proper coin, and placing said meter in operation, the parking meter space may be lawfully occupied by such vehicle during the period of parking time which has been prescribed for the part of the street in which said parking meter space is located. 


