Schools' Peak Seen in 1957

Enrollment of 378,000 Pupils Expected, Commissioner Reports

Hartford, Oct. 22.—(AP)—The State Department of Education estimates that enrollment in Connecticut's public schools will reach a peak of 378,000 pupils in 1957-58, says a report issued today. The department estimates that 1956-57 enrollment was 368,000, and that 1957-58 enrollment will be 378,000. The report also indicates that the number of teachers will increase from 12,500 in 1956-57 to 13,500 in 1957-58. The department estimates that the total cost of the 1957-58 school year will be \$180,000,000, an increase of \$10,000,000 over the 1956-57 year. Housing Project Seeks Guarantee

Hartford, Oct. 22.—(AP)—The State Housing Commission will hold a special meeting Monday at 10:15 a. m. to act on a request for an additional \$50,000 bond guarantee for a 160-unit moderate rental project in Waterbury. The state already has guaranteed \$1,950,000 in bonds for the Waterbury project, and the governor's office said the additional amount was needed before construction can start. The Waterbury request already has been approved by the State Housing Authority, and the commission's approval was anticipated by the governor's office. The Waterbury Housing Authority has notified the state that construction will start within 48 hours after the commission approves the new bond guarantee.

Shannon Tells Schools' Cost Education Takes Place Alongside Housing and Prices in Campaign

Education took its place alongside housing and high prices today as one of the things candidates are talking about in the Connecticut campaign. Gov. James C. Shannon contended last night that the state's education program "ranks near the bottom" of the Democratic opponent, Chester Bowles, has claimed the state should do more for education.

Shannon, in his discussion of education, disclosed figures on school costs which he said had never before been made public. Connecticut spends an aggregate of \$54,000,000 on education each year, the governor said. "Nearly forty million dollars of this," he said, "is paid in taxes and city taxes, principally on real estate. The balance, thirty-four million dollars is paid by the state. The eleven million dollars in annual grants and the balance for the operation of the state Board of Education and for various state educational institutions."

"Let's put it another way. We are spending about \$1200 a week during the school year to run our schools. The toll amounts to about \$120 a year for each family in the state."

Bowles, in a counter-statement, said White evidently was "being forced to recent statements" he had actually made.
