Republicans Prepare Welcome for Dewey

Hope Crowds to Greet Presidential Nominee Will Outnumber Those on Truman's Tour

Connecticut Republicans prepared a welcome tour for their presidential nominee, Thomas E. Dewey, as he begins his campaign travels through the state en route to New York.

Dewey's schedule calls for stops at New London, 1:30 p. m., New Haven, 3:10, and Bridgeport, 5:30. G. O. P. leaders were hoping that the crowds which greet him will outnumber those which gather yesterday when President Truman passed over the same route, making one additional stop at South Norwalk.

The Republican nominee's tour continues a parade of presidential candidates through the closing days of the campaign. Mr. Truman started it with a visit Wednesday to Hartford where about 100,000 people were greeted by an estimated 100,000 people.

Henry A. Wallace, Progressive party candidate, spoke before about 3,500 at the state haven that night, and the state man swung back through the state yesterday, speaking before audiences estimated by party leaders to total 50,000.

A fourth presidential nominee, Socialist Norman Thomas, speaks in Bridgeport tonight and at Norwalk tomorrow night.

Jubilant Over Reception
Democratic leaders were jubilant over yesterday's reception for Mr. Truman. State Chairman John M. Bailey said the crowds were of "incredible size," indicating a "tremendous tide for a Democratic victory."

The Truman visit shifted the campaign spotlight from state to national issues temporarily, but within hours after his departure the rival candidates were again slugging it at each other.

Shannon Battles Democrats
Gov. James C. Shannon belated Democrats for what he called their silence about veterans and veterans' care. He said that Connecticut had begun planning a veterans program before the war ended and emphasized that "payment of the veterans bonus was a fulfillment of a Republican campaign pledge made in 1946."

On this, as well as on other platform pledges, the governor said, the Republican party had "kept its faith with the voters."

"If you elect me governor," he said, "we shall continue that policy of honesty."

Shannon's Democratic opponent, Chester Bowles, meanwhile reviewed the housing, old age, assistance, labor relations and price issues he has raised in the campaign. On all of them, he contended, Governor Shannon "has no answer or desire to answer the problems faced by the people of Connecticut."

Charges "Factual Errors"
Bailey got back into the state campaign with a charge that the Republicans were spending "unlimited amounts of money" for advertising containing what he called "factual errors."

Would Triple Health Funds

State Public Health Council Favors Budget of \$8,374,053

Hartford, Oct. 29.—The 1949 General Assembly will be asked to triple the state health department's budget.

Approved yesterday by the State Public Health Council was a proposed budget of \$8,374,053 for the two years ending July 1, 1949. The budget for the current biennium is \$2,800,000.

New Items Sought
New items which the department and the council would like the legislators to approve include \$1,057,000 for a health department building, the department now housed in three separate buildings in Hartford, made a similar request in 1947, but was turned down by the Legislature.

Other new requests include: Chronic disease program, \$787,044; medical service to state employees, \$132,044; conservation of hearing program, \$65,876; increased grants to general hospitals for mental hygiene clinics, \$116,000; two additional mental hygiene units in the department, \$203,446; increased grants to hospitals for cancer clinics, \$100,000.
