Fully insured was given as the probable cause of a midnight fire last night that completely destroyed a large, equipment-filled barn and damaged a chicken house owned by Joseph Krausz, 100 Union street. The damage, only a small portion of which is covered by insurance, is estimated at \$4,000. Chief John Alers of the Manchester Fire department said today that evidence indicates the fire started around an underground electric wire that runs from the house to the barn.

The fire was well under way, however, before the blaze was discovered and when the firemen arrived, the building was too far gone to be saved. Flames from the burning barn were visible for miles.
