ed on Oct. 15, 1941, but the Japanese admirals opposed this idea. Naval orders on Nov. 10 fixed Dec. 8 (Japanese time, Dec. 7, U. S. time) as the day after which an automatic state of war would exist. Fleet units completed battle preparations on Nov. 20 and departed from Manila on Nov. 23. The Japanese fleet sailed from the Kuriles on Nov. 26.

All of this time negotiations for a peaceful settlement continued in Washington but, said the speaker, "leaders of Japan had never been prepared to surrender the booty of the past and to abandon the booty in prospect."

Tojo and seven of his principal associates attended all of the series of policy making conferences including those in the emperor's presence—which evolved the war strategy based on the Hawaiian assault, the attack on Pearl Harbor and the attack on the Philippines.

The court also found that Japan's counsel general in Hawaii at the time of the Pearl Harbor attack was "wagued in espionage."

The judgment convicted Japan of waging aggressive war against the United States, Britain, other non-belligerent nations, France, The Netherlands, China and Russia.

Only in the case of Siam (Thailand) did the court hold for the Japanese. The tribunal found that Siam had permitted Japanese troops to move freely through that country and thus held that Japan was not guilty of waging aggressive war against that country.

He is expected to propose to one of the Big Four powers that the Berlin case be considered by the Assembly in the light of a previous resolution appealing to the United States, Russia, Britain and France to resolve their differences. The Assembly recently adopted the resolution unanimously.

Berlin, Nov. 11.—(AP)—American and British planes flew the supply route to Berlin today in the face of a Russian threat to force down planes straying from the 20-mile wide air corridors to the former German capital.

The American answer to the Russian threat, made last night, was a terse pronouncement from Gen. Joseph D. City, American military governor, that "we will keep flying."

Both British and U. S. authorities said publicly the Russians would be held responsible for any action they take.

The Russian, citing a long list of alleged violations of that territory, also said they would force down the Soviet planes, including the three air corridors.

The second threat presumably refers to non-military planes, which do not carry nationality markers. The Russians have complained of commercial flights in the Berlin air corridors.

Some official sources tended to discount the Soviet note as another move in the "west of war."

Post American Warning
The Russian pointed another warning at the Berlin Air Safety Council, saying they would force down any aircraft straying from the 20-mile wide air corridors. They said they would hold "local flying maneuvers."

Although both Britain and the U. S. have said in the past they would use fighter escorts if necessary to keep the air safe, American pilots said they had standing orders to obey any Soviet fighter plane seeking to force them to land.
