





Tojo and seven of his principal associates attended all of the series of policy making conferences—including some in the emperor's presence—which evolved the war strategy based on the Hawaiian assault, the court ruled.

The court also found that Japan's consul general in Hawaii at the time of the Pearl Harbor attack was "engaged in espionage."

The judgment convicted Japan of waging aggressive wars against the United States, British commonwealth nations, France, The Netherlands, China and Russia.

Only in the case of Siam (Thailard) did the court hold for the Japanese. The tribunal found that Siam had permitted Japanese troops to move freely through that country and thus held that Japan was not guilty of waging aggressive war against that country.

Talk Is Given On Children

Iollister PTA Hears Informative Address by a

"The principle aim of all parents in raising their children is to give them the ability to get along with other people," stated Miss Pauline Peters, child psychologist from Willimantic State Teachers' College, in her talk to the Hollister PTA Tuesday evening. Dealing with human beings is always difficult because of the tremendous variety of factors involved, she continued. How we fulfill human needs determines the type of person the child becomes.

needs determines the type of person the child becomes.

Miss Peters listed four primary
psychological needs in her speech
on "Helping Your Child to Grow."
The first was affectional relationships: the second, status; the
third, relationships to one's group,
and the last, one's picture of one's
own self. The outstanding point in
all parts of the talk was the necessity for parent and teacher to
realize the great adjustments required of the child in various stages
of growth. Under the first division growth. Under the first division

of growth. Under the first division of affectional relationships. Miss Petera emphasized the necessity of love to integrate personality. This is manifested from infancy on in more ways than ordinarily considered and is a leading factor in giving the child the important feeling of security. Any time the child faces a change such as moving to a new home, entering school or graduating from elementary education to high school and college, he has his security threatened and must make many adjustments. She said, "A child's naughtiness is merely his way of trying to solve some problem in his life. All children want to be good and loved by the adults in their lives."

The psychologist explained that under status the child desires to be accepted and liked. Too often family prestige, physical attractiveness and high I. Q. are the criteria of a readily accepted child. Miss Peters suggested that people be more "accepting" because everyone has a contribution to make and 'acceptance and tolerance makes a better democracy. ersone has a contribution to make and acceptance and tolerance makes a better democracy.

Need Respect and Love
In relationships to one's own group, Miss Peters reminded her listeners that children want to be like their playmates, especially in the middle grade group. Minor things may be important at this stage and lead to rejection from school of play groups. One's picture of one's own self is also important, said Miss Peters, because everyone needs to have respect and
