Senator Wagner, who has been in office for months, will become the chief Democratic voice on the committee. He is expected to be re-elected in 1950.

The Grange would fight Cooley's bill to kill improvements in the Federal farm program.

The new farm law would lower parity prices on most crops and raise them on most livestock products.

It also would replace the present rigid 90 per cent parity price supports for basic crops with a system of flexible supports ranging from 60 to 90 per cent of parity.

Supports would be high in times of shortage and low in times of surplus to discourage overproduction and to encourage overproduction.

Would Cut Need of Controls

Some who were among the first to urge the flexible system, fear it because, he said, it would lessen the need for government controls.

Cooley, on the other hand, fears a continuation of controls at par level. He would couple them with government production and marketing controls to prevent surplus.

Members said he believed Cooley would run into opposition from President Truman and Secretary of Agriculture Brannan. Both recommended the parity revision and flexible supports to the 80th Congress. They reiterated their support of them during the recent campaign.

In fact, the Democratic administration urged that they be made effective in 1949 instead of 1950 as Congress decided.

A colorful career, Denham was an NLRB trial examiner when Mr. Truman appointed him general counsel after Congress enacted the Taft-Hartley law and the presidential veto.

Blurred Words of Taft-Hartley

Denham, a Republican, quickly altered the words of labor unions by his right enforcement of the new law. At the outset he ruled that no AFL or CIO union could use the NLRB's facilities until top officers of the two groups signed the controversial non-Communist affidavit.

The five-man NLRB soon revised this interpretation, however. It suspended top AFL and CIO officers from the affidavit requirement, but held that officers of individual member unions must sign the pledge.

Police Guard Water Front

Special police patrols guarded the New York water front today, but all was peaceful.

Up to 10,000 of New York's 20,000-odd members of the AFL International Longshoremen's association (ILA) were reported to have joined the walkout which began yesterday.

Custom house figures showed 41 ships were affected here immediately as a result of the west coast strike. Yesterday's rain, which normally would curtail dock work, and today's Armistice day holiday obscured the full impact of the walkout.

About 6,000 dock workers rejected the tentative union agreement for a basic wage increase of ten cents an hour along with other benefits. Vertical paralysis of docking in the district was forecast by union leaders.

Differs on Boston Effect

Although International ILA President Joseph P. Ryan argued in New York that 5,000 Longshoremen quit work in Boston yesterday, J. Alex Crothers, head of the Port of Boston Authority, said Boston harbor would be affected if the walkout ends tomorrow.

Estimates given by his office indicated that only between 300 and 400 of the city's 1,500 Longshoremen actually stopped work and that no more were currently employed. Few ships were in port.

Seven ships sailed yesterday without difficulty. Only four ships were due today and two—tanker and a collier—presented no unloading problems.

But the situation in Boston dock work seems serious if the walkout were to continue into next week. The annual Christmas sale will arrive on Sunday.

Portland, Me., Longshoremen have withheld strike action. Shipping operations in the nation's east and Gulf coast ports depended upon three-day voting on the wage pact by 65,000 members of I.L.A. locals in ports from Maine to Virginia. The voting ended tonight.
