## Electricity Cost Decrease Steady

Hartford, Nov. 12 — (F) — The average cost of domestic electricity produced by the Connecticut Light and Power Company has decreased steadily since 1920, Sherman R. Knapp of Simsbury, assistant to the company's president, testified at a public hearing today before the Public Utilities Commission in the State Capitol.

Mr. Knapp spoke in behalf of the company's petition for a 10 per cent increase in its electric rate and a nine per cent increase in its gas rate.

He submitted a chart which traced the decline of the average cost of domestic electricity as compared with the spiralling cost of living, prepared by the Bureau of Labor Statistics.

Seymour Refuses to Be Listed

The announcement said that

Charles Seymour, Yale president, had refused to be listed as a sponsor on the grounds that he did not agree with Dean Johnson's views. It quoted him as saying, however, that "I am ready to back the dean of Cantenbury's right to speak and enjoy the hospitality of Yale university."

In addition to Dr. Seymour, President G. Keith Funston of Trinity college and Dean Percy L. Urban of the Berkley Divinity school were listed as having declined invitations.

Theodore Green, a Yale professor who is a member of the Welcoming committee, said the general sentiment of the sponsors was that they do not in any way necessarily endorse what the speakers has to say, of course, but regardless of point of view, especially in conservative Yale, Dr. Johnson represents an opinion that ought to be heard."

The "Red dean's" original application to visit this country, under the auspices of the American-Soviet Friendship committee, was rejected several months ago by the State department. The department gave as a reason the inclusion of that committee on the attorney general's list of "subversive" organizations.
