Secretary Marshall's bias against Russia's peacemongering, the extraordinary step of directing an appeal to the Big Four powers to end immediate diplomatic conversations to end the Berlin deadlock, and thus take it off the back of the United Nations.

Now it remains to be seen how Secretary Marshall and the United States react to this. It would obviously be Secretary Marshall's inclination, judging by his past policy, to consider this new move more as a peace propaganda move. If his policy is followed, we will turn the proposal down, and thus demonstrate, once more, that we are made of unyielding diplomatic iron.

But Dr. Eviatt and Mr. Lee are not Russian tools. They represent their own countries, Australia and Norway, and they represent the United Nations, which has lately been reeling under the determination of the big powers to use the United Nations for propaganda war with one another. Their view is a middle view. It is going to be a little difficult to determine whether they are peacemongers and to discard their proposal as a plot to create a mirage and an illusion of some impossible trend toward peace.

We can turn their proposal down, but only at the risk of presenting our own moral position in the world, only at the risk of making Russian peace propaganda look better, only at the risk of making Russian charges that we are the ones who do not intend peace seem more substantial.

**Connecticut Yankee**

We spent considerable time, before the election, describing the long and arduous one with which the Republican state machine was preparing itself for an idyllic session of the General Assembly. With infinite care and pains, during the caucus and primary season, the state organization reached out the long arm of planned purge and succeeded in eliminating, one by one in their separate towns, a good many of those party legislators who had been guilty of one crime or another in the 1947 session. These crimes were easily catalogued: the offending legislator had voted against a Republican policy measure, like the sales tax; he had voted against a Republican measure for which high Republican party leaders were the lobbyists; or he had, perhaps, merely spoken his own mind in some of the heated discussions of the session.

Even before the election was held, it was apparent that the Republican state machine was going to be a better disciplined affair in the 1948 session.

The program carried through to election day. Where the state organization occasionally failed in an attempted nomination, it carried it, en masse toward independent legislators in the voting on election day. Better a Democratic vote than a rebellious Republican!

What was to come out of this was a collection of Republican legislators completely subservient to the Republican state machine, as represented by those county leaders and Republican State Central Committee members who so often appeared in the well of the House when votes were being taken.

With such an idyllic state of affairs obtaining, those fine lobbyist measures which ran into trouble during the 1947 session, trouble which kept burning out because legislators had minds of their own, were now to be assured of passage. This state of affairs was to mean that the realtor's licensing bill would go through, that the even the famous denture bill would take a new bite on legislative life, that the Hartford Retreat would get special tax exemption by legislative action.

In short, the Republican legislative steamroller was to have no obstacles in its path and to be all-powerful, and it was to be certain of its power that it could well afford to be polite in public. It wouldn't need to run down opposition within its own party. That position had been liquidated. A severe had the path before any steamroller been made more smooth. **The Eviatt-Lie Proposal**

Toward the end of last week Secretary of State George C. Marshall was deploring the existence of a Russian "peace propaganda offensive." He took the position that the wily Russians were seeking to demoralize and weaken Western intentions by making false offers of peace, none of which in reality was nothing more than a dry and useless waffle.

And there was a large measure of truth in his statement. Russia indeed wants to talk peace, but Russia still has certain essentials Russia wants to gain from peace. Russia wants to be able to save her own face diplomatically. Russia still insists that if the Western powers go ahead with their own plans for a separate government in western Germany Russia has the right to counter by taking Berlin.

So, when Secretary Marshall charges that Russia, in her peace propaganda, isn't really intending to make peace according to his definitions, he is right. For the definition of peace is that Russia yield to us, both in the classification of face and in that of reality.

For a picture of some one who really wants peace, Secretary Marshall bids the world look at the United States and himself. But actually our position is perhaps more yielding than Russia's. We want peace, but we want it only on our own terms. Our version of peace is unconditional diplomatic and factual surrender by Russia.

So the situation between Russia and ourselves is one of two hard and fast attitudes. When Russia talks of peace, it doesn't necessarily mean very much. When we talk of peace, it doesn't mean much either. Peace is not made of talk, but of concessions.

Nevertheless, it is a fact that, owing to the persistence of the smaller, neutral nations, these two hard and fast attitudes, the part of Russia and the United States have been narrowed down to a single technical point. As the dispute over Berlin now stands technically, its solution depends upon whether or not the introduction of Soviet currency into an unchanged position inside Germany can be co-termined with the abandonment of the Berlin blockade by Russia.

The west, so far, is insisting that the end of the Berlin blockade come as a separate, advance act, which Russia must yield while taking its chances that there will be subsequent agreement on the Berlin currency question.

Russia is insisting that there be something definite about currency before the Berlin blockade is lifted.

If Russia were yielded to on this specific point, it would mean in the tradition of Russian diplomacy for Russia suddenly, at the last minute, to bring up some other point, or seek some additional concession.

But on this specific point, Russia is not really being extreme. It is the same with which the west could yield something on this point which caused Dr. Herbert V. Eviatt, of Australia, president of the General Assembly, to remark that the difference between East and West over Berlin are now no greater than the difference between Tweedledum and Tweedledee.

And it is because it is so obviously Tweedledum and Tweedledee—not for any long range settlement of all the hostilities between East and West, but for the removal of Berlin as a hot point of dangerous immediate friction—that Dr. Eviatt and Secretary General Trygve Lie took, at the end of the week, immediately after

So, when Secretary Marshall charges that Russia, in her peace propaganda, isn't really intending to make peace according to his definitions, he is right. For the definition of peace is that Russia yield to us, both in the classification of face and in that of reality.

For a picture of some one who really wants peace, Secretary Marshall bids the world look at the United States and himself. But actually our position is perhaps more yielding than Russia's. We want peace, but we want it only on our own terms. Our version of peace is unconditional diplomatic and factual surrender by Russia.

So the situation between Russia and ourselves is one of two hard and fast attitudes. When Russia talks of peace, it doesn't necessarily mean very much. When we talk of peace, it doesn't mean much either. Peace is not made of talk, but of concessions.

Nevertheless, it is a fact that, owing to the persistence of the smaller, neutral nations, these two hard and fast attitudes, the part of Russia and the United States have been narrowed down to a single technical point. As the dispute over Berlin now stands technically, its solution depends upon whether or not the introduction of Soviet currency into an unchanged position inside Germany can be co-termined with the abandonment of the Berlin blockade by Russia.

The west, so far, is insisting that the end of the Berlin blockade come as a separate, advance act, which Russia must yield while taking its chances that there will be subsequent agreement on the Berlin currency question.

Russia is insisting that there be something definite about currency before the Berlin blockade is lifted.

If Russia were yielded to on this specific point, it would mean in the tradition of Russian diplomacy for Russia suddenly, at the last minute, to bring up some other point, or seek some additional concession.

But on this specific point, Russia is not really being extreme. It is the same with which the west could yield something on this point which caused Dr. Herbert V. Eviatt, of Australia, president of the General Assembly, to remark that the difference between East and West over Berlin are now no greater than the difference between Tweedledum and Tweedledee.

And it is because it is so obviously Tweedledum and Tweedledee—not for any long range settlement of all the hostilities between East and West, but for the removal of Berlin as a hot point of dangerous immediate friction—that Dr. Eviatt and Secretary General Trygve Lie took, at the end of the week, immediately after
