Two Soldiers' Bodies Arrive
Remains of Local Men Killed in War are Now in United States

The remains of Pfc. Alton R. Hare, killed in action in France, Nov. 7, 1944, and Pfc. Angelo Zito, killed in action in Germany, March 21, 1945, are among the 3,072 bodies that have been returned to the United States from Europe aboard the Army transport Carroll Victory, the Department of the Army announced today.

Pfc. Hare is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Ernest J. Hare, 76 Park street. A native of New Brunswick, he attended Portland schools and enlisted in the Army on Aug. 27, 1943. Prior to his enlistment he was employed at the Pratt & Whitney Division of United Aircraft in East Hartford. He trained at Fort McClellan, Ala., and Fort Meade, Md., before shipping overseas.

Pfc. Zito, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Vito Zito of 45 Dutton street, was born in Manchester and attended local schools. He was graduated from Manchester High school and Howell Chasey Technical school in 1939 and entered the employ of the United Tool and Die in Hartford.

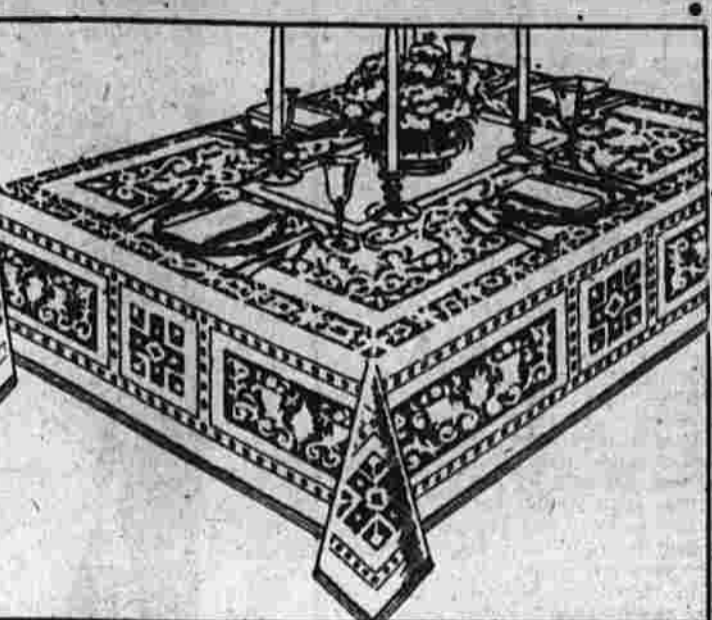
Entering the service on July 20, 1944 he took his basic training at Fort McClellan, Ala. He went overseas in January of 1945 and was with the 45th Thunderbird Division of the Seventh Army.

Besides his parents, Pfc. Zito is survived by his wife, Mrs. Beatrice L. Zito, 123 Washington street, Hartford, a son, Francis, and two sisters, Frances and Antonette, both of Manchester. It will be remembered that Francis Zito was one of the two children who survived the memorial shaft at Munter Park on Armistice Day.



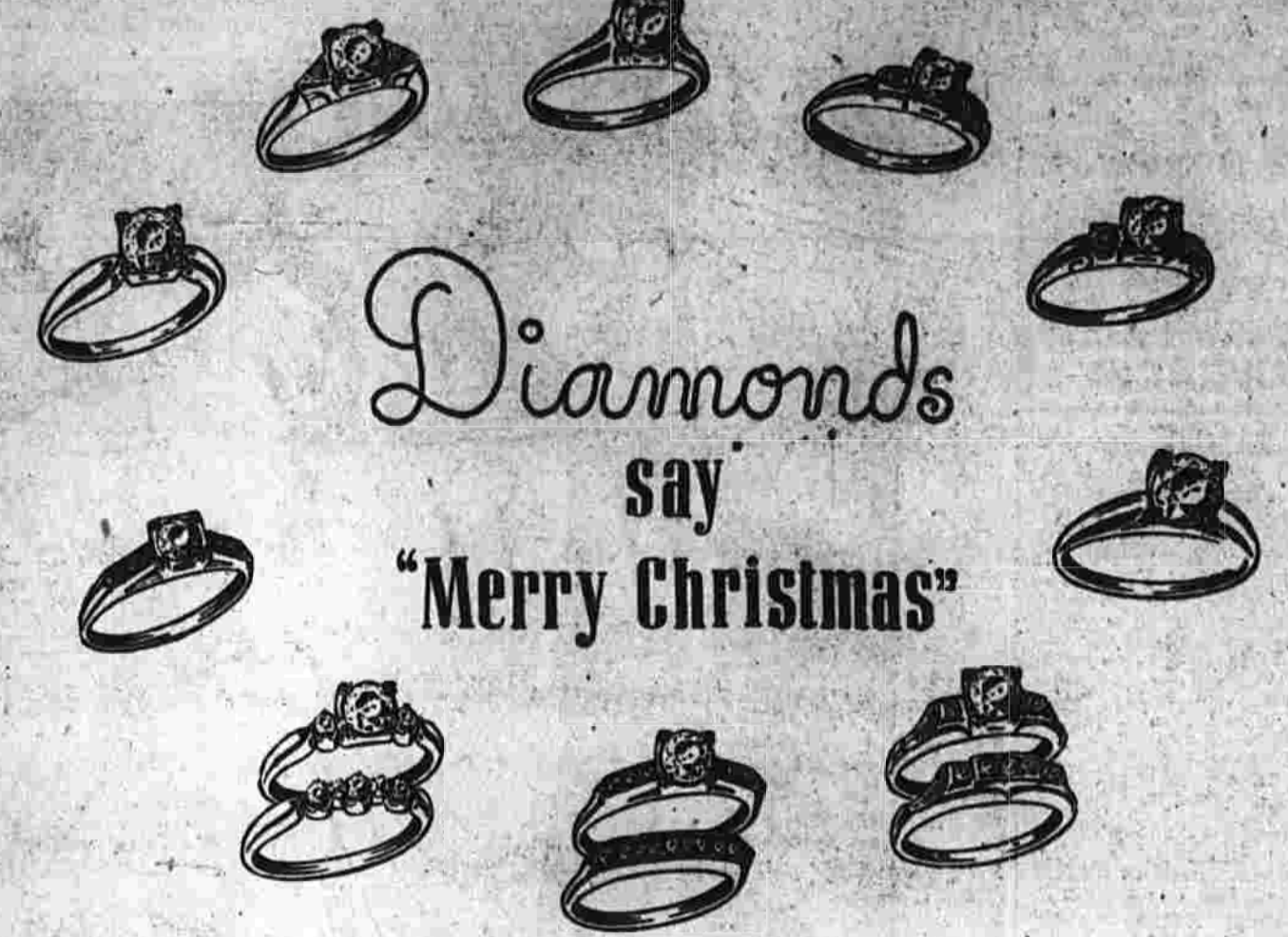

Glenn Proposes Raises for All

Hartford, Nov. 17.—(AP)—More money for old age pensioners, school teachers, state employees and legislators is proposed by State Rep. Lawrence M. Glenn (R-Bozrah).

He filed in the secretary of the state's office yesterday bills which would:

- Increase old age assistance benefits from \$50 to \$70 a month. Set \$2,400 as the minimum salary for school teachers.
- Give state employees a 25 per cent wage increase and continue in effect all temporary cost-of-living allowances now being paid.
- Increase the transportation allowance for state legislators from 10 to 20 cents a mile.

Glenn said he was also preparing a bill which would raise by 20 per cent the pay of the governor, all state officers, commissioners, deputies and personal secretaries not under the merit system.

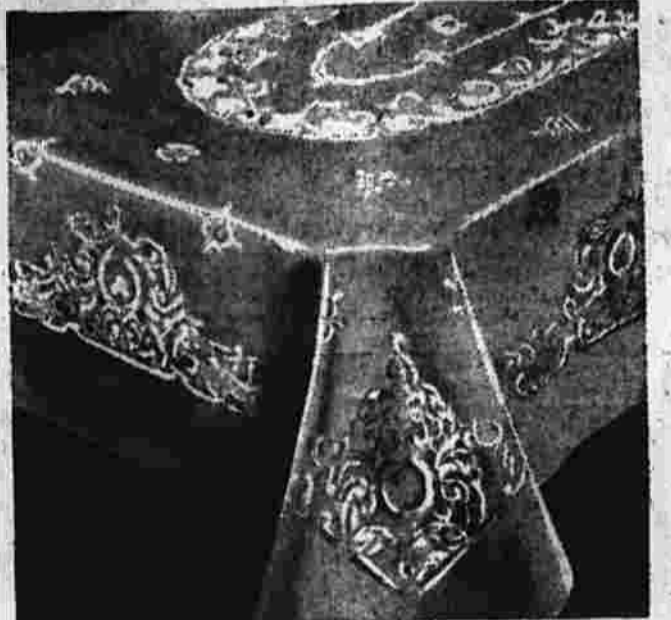
