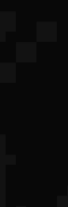

Named Judge For Contest

Martin on Board to Decide Merit of Reports of State Towns

Storrs, Nov. 24.—(Special)—A board of three judges for the 1948 Connecticut town and city annual report contest was announced today by Joseph M. Longhin, director of the Institute of Public Service, University of Connecticut. The contest which is conducted annually by the Institute of Public Service, has as its purpose improved reporting to taxpayers by local public officials. Named to the board of judges are Ward E. Duff, associate editor of The Hartford Times; Harry P. Morse of New Haven, publisher of the Connecticut circle and president of the Connecticut Editors' association; and Richard Martin of Manchester, director of the state water commission and former member of the Manchester board of directors. The winning town or city will be judged with the winners from the other four groups for the best report in this region.
