Higher Phone Bills in Works

Applications Pending in 29 States for \$240,000,000 Increase

New York, Dec. 2.—Higher telephone bills are in the works for millions of Americans, many of whom already have had their rates increased.

The American Telephone and Telegraph Co. says its Bell system subsidiaries have applications pending in 29 states for \$240,000,000 a year in rate increases to cover their own higher cost of doing business.

These are in addition to \$100,000,000 a year in rate increases already granted since the war in the first general increase in more than 10 years.

—Rate Increases Low. Telephone companies, company officials term the increases very low in comparison with their increased costs and with the higher prices of other things the customer buys.

They estimate the increases already in effect at 14 per cent of the total telephone bill of customers for local service and toll calls within the states. The percentage would be smaller, they declare, if later state long distance service—which hasn't gone up—were included.

If the pending applications should be granted in full, they add, the post-war increase would total average about 22 per cent. Long distance service is included, about 17 per cent.

Increase now have been granted or applied for in 46 states. The exceptions, Nevada and Delaware, probably will be added to the roll call soon.

Among recent applications where no increase previously had been asked are those in New York for \$40,000,000 or 14 per cent and Pennsylvania for \$25,000,000 or 18 per cent.

Recent applications for additional increases include Nevada and Delaware, 18 per cent in Illinois and \$35,000,000 or 13 per cent in California. State boards also have been asked in the past few weeks for Maryland, West Virginia and Washington.

A. T. and T. spokesman says that more applications will be made by companies whose rates have not yet been adjusted to meet present cost levels.

They say the rate increases are tied directly to inflation. If prices stabilize at present levels, they declare, the present round of rate boosts—including those already planned but not yet applied for—should be the last.

They estimate that rate cuts on all types of service made between 1920 and the start of the last war would amount to \$200,000,000.

Church Council Plans Progress

Christmas, Dec. 2.—Two small denominations, the Quaker and the Roman Catholic, are planning to join in a national council of churches of Christ in America.

The Federal Council, yesterday approved in principle a plan to join the two denominations in a national council of churches of Christ in America.

The national council, if approved, would embrace virtually every Protestant denomination in the nation. As in the Federal Council, each denomination in the project has agreed to cooperate in the common interest.

Dr. Luther A. Weigle, chairman of the Federal Council, said the proposed merger would be completed by 1950.

Applications Pending in 29 States for \$240,000,000 Increase

New York, Dec. 2.—Higher telephone bills are in the works for millions of Americans, many of whom already have had their rates increased.

The American Telephone and Telegraph Co. says its Bell system subsidiaries have applications pending in 29 states for \$240,000,000 a year in rate increases to cover their own higher cost of doing business.

These are in addition to \$100,000,000 a year in rate increases already granted since the war in the first general increase in more than 10 years.

—Rate Increases Low. Telephone companies, company officials term the increases very low in comparison with their increased costs and with the higher prices of other things the customer buys.

They estimate the increases already in effect at 14 per cent of the total telephone bill of customers for local service and toll calls within the states. The percentage would be smaller, they declare, if later state long distance service—which hasn't gone up—were included.

If the pending applications should be granted in full, they add, the post-war increase would total average about 22 per cent. Long distance service is included, about 17 per cent.

Increase now have been granted or applied for in 46 states. The exceptions, Nevada and Delaware, probably will be added to the roll call soon.

Among recent applications where no increase previously had been asked are those in New York for \$40,000,000 or 14 per cent and Pennsylvania for \$25,000,000 or 18 per cent.

Recent applications for additional increases include Nevada and Delaware, 18 per cent in Illinois and \$35,000,000 or 13 per cent in California. State boards also have been asked in the past few weeks for Maryland, West Virginia and Washington.

A. T. and T. spokesman says that more applications will be made by companies whose rates have not yet been adjusted to meet present cost levels.

They say the rate increases are tied directly to inflation. If prices stabilize at present levels, they declare, the present round of rate boosts—including those already planned but not yet applied for—should be the last.

They estimate that rate cuts on all types of service made between 1920 and the start of the last war would amount to \$200,000,000.

New Haven County Coroner Orders Autopsy To Discover Cause

Hamden, Dec. 2.—The mysterious death of a 38-year-old New Haven divorcee was under investigation today by Hamden police and the New Haven county coroner.

James J. Corrigan, coroner, has ordered an autopsy.

The woman, whose fully-clothed body was found shoeless in the deep woods here yesterday by a hunter, was identified a few hours afterwards by Capt. John Fordan, a member of the Merchant Marine, as his divorced wife, Doris Clark Fordan.

Divorced Six Years Ago Fordan, who lives in the Mt. Carmel section of Hamden, said he and his wife were divorced about six years ago. He said he was shocked at his wife's death but added he was unable to give much information.

"You see," he told reporters, "once we separated we never kept in contact."

Police theorized Mrs. Fordan died some time after Monday's snow storm since snow was found under her body. They said an external examination disclosed bruises and scratches on the lower legs, a scratch on the thigh and a clot of dried blood beneath the nose.

Fordan was called upon to identify the woman after Assistant City Attorney Raymond S. Doyle of New Haven recalled that he had represented her in divorce action. Doyle said that about two years ago Mrs. Fordan wandered away from home and into another wooded section of Hamden and was missing for two or three days before she returned to her home.

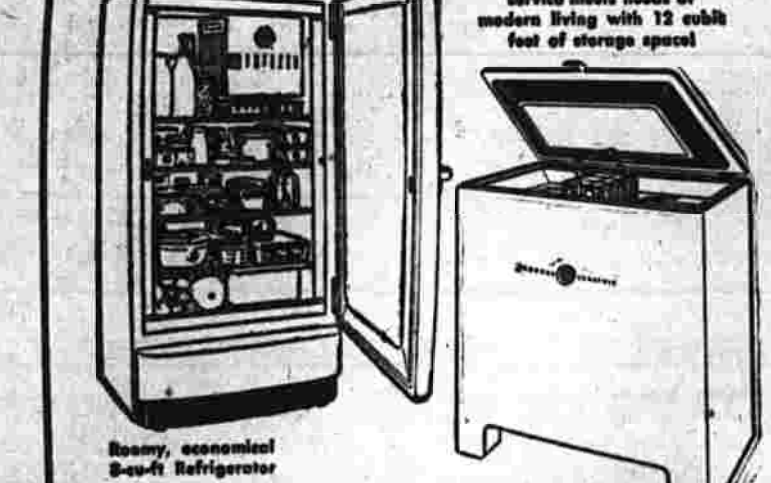
