Washington, Dec. 3.—(AP)—Midget films of secret State department papers, pulled from a pumpkin by an admitted former Communist agent, have suddenly set the Red spy hunt going again in Congress. The House Un-American Activities committee took to the radio and telephone to round up members for more hearings.

Gets More Documents
From Whitaker Chambers, a Time magazine editor who said he used to be a Communist courier, the committee got more documents from those two occasions from microfilm he hid in a hollow pumpkin on his Westchester, Md., farm.
