Rockville Study Group Files Report

Rockville Committee Suggests Changes to The Mayor

Rockville, Dec. 8.—(Special) Early in his administration, Mayor Fred Berger appointed a non-partisan Economy committee to study the tax structure of the city government and to suggest proposed modifications or changes that might be made. The committee consists of William J. Dunlap, chairman, Robert W. Murphy, secretary, Kenneth H. Smith, and John T. McConville. This committee has submitted its report to the Common Council which includes the following recommendations:

"We suggest that the mayor appoint an active and competent development committee that will work with the state development commission to encourage new industry, and to develop Rockville as a residential area.

"We believe that complete revaluation of all taxable property should be made. The city assessors have always copied the town assessment figures and unless the city makes its own assessment, the matter must rest with the town assessors.

"We suggest that the city and town assessors do not receive sufficient compensation to make a real survey of the taxable property in the city or town—We believe a fair and impartial revaluation by competent outside experts would more than pay for its expense.

"We believe that many people feel that the dual form of government in the city and town should be abolished in favor of consolidation.

"The mayor and members of the Council are elected by citizens, the business affairs of the city, while department heads and other employees are appointed to carry out their orders and instructions. Advance planning reports should be submitted by the department heads to the committees concerned for approval, and the mayor should make work progress reports. Politics should be forgotten after an election is completed and all officials, department heads, and employees should work as an official family to give the city an efficient and economic government.

"One important matter that should be taken care of by the police department this coming winter, and that is the ordinance relating to sidewalk snow removal and sanding. We suggest that the police enforce the law strictly, regardless of who the offender might be, with a reasonable time after the storm is over.

"Efficient municipal purchasing is primarily a matter of competition. A centralized purchasing system not only assures favorable prices but is responsible for other important economies. In any city where local buying of materials and supplies is not controlled, it is customary to buy miscellaneous requirements at retail prices, even through the city's annual purchases run well into wholesale quantities. This practice, of course, is unreasonably expensive and the city should work out suitable arrangements with local merchants which will enable them to obtain the quantities they are warranted. We believe that an efficient centralized system of buying would save be-
