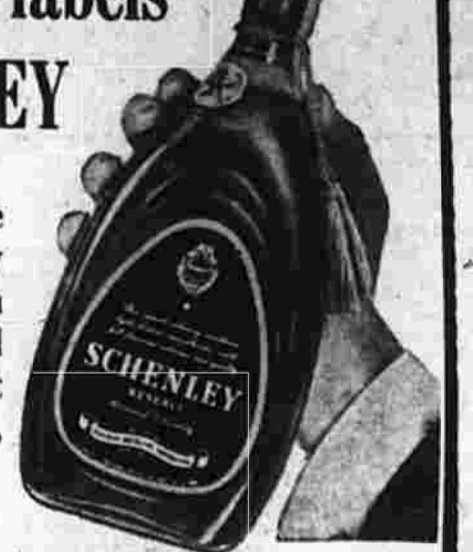

317th troop carrier wing will transfer "this month" from Tach-Haw, Japan, to Germany. About 1,000 more men will be added to the outfit before it arrives in Europe. (The normal strength of a troop carrier wing is approximately 1,500.)

Permanent Assignment

In answer to a question, Air Force spokesmen said the five transport outfits are "stationed" in Germany instead of being there on "temporary duty." In military language, this indicates a permanent assignment as distinguished from a limited time mission.

Of the nation's nine troop carrier wings, four now are in Europe, two in the Far East Air Force, and three in continental United States. (A wing includes a plane group, plus the unit's service and administrative headquarters.)

If the Berlin blockade operations should cease before June 30, it is probable that one of the carrier wings would be abandoned. If not, some officials indicated adjustments might be made in some other units to keep the Air Force expansion plan on schedule. With current funds, the Air Force expects to add five B-29 groups and two long range reconnaissance groups by next June.

Will Get Jet Fighters

In redeploying the three overseas units, the 23rd Fighter wing, presently based at Guam, will be sent to Hozard Air Force base, Panama Canal Zone next April. The 23rd now flies conventional engine F-47 fighters, but will be equipped with jet fighters upon arrival in Panama. The wing has about 1,500 men and operates with about 75 planes.

The canal, for the first time since last summer, then will have a full group of modern jet fighters for its defense. The 96th wing, a jet outfit, was shifted to Germany last August.

As far as can be learned, there are no immediate plans to all the vacancy in Guam when the 23rd leaves. Guam is headquarters for the 20th Air Force, a B-29 unit of the Far East Air Force.

The third transfer will bring the 91st Reconnaissance squadron from the American air base in Trinidad, to McGuire base, Fort Dix, N. J., within the next 40 days. The 91st, with 885 men and officers, will be replaced at McGuire by the 317th planes used for patrol.

Dobbs, Socialist Workers, 13,007, and the rest scattered.

Truman won by a plurality of 2,135,336, but it was the first time since 1916 that a winner has failed to capture a majority of all votes cast. His percentage was 48.5. Dewey's was 45.1, and the others combined 6.4.

Although this year's total vote was nearly 1,400,000 above that of 1944, the number of potential voters—that is, people of voting age—had increased more than 10,000,000 in the past four years.

Thus the ratio of votes actually cast was much smaller, compared with the previous two elections. This was due primarily to a falling off of balloting in the big states.

Sixteen in all showed fewer votes than in 1944. Among these were New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Illinois and Indiana.

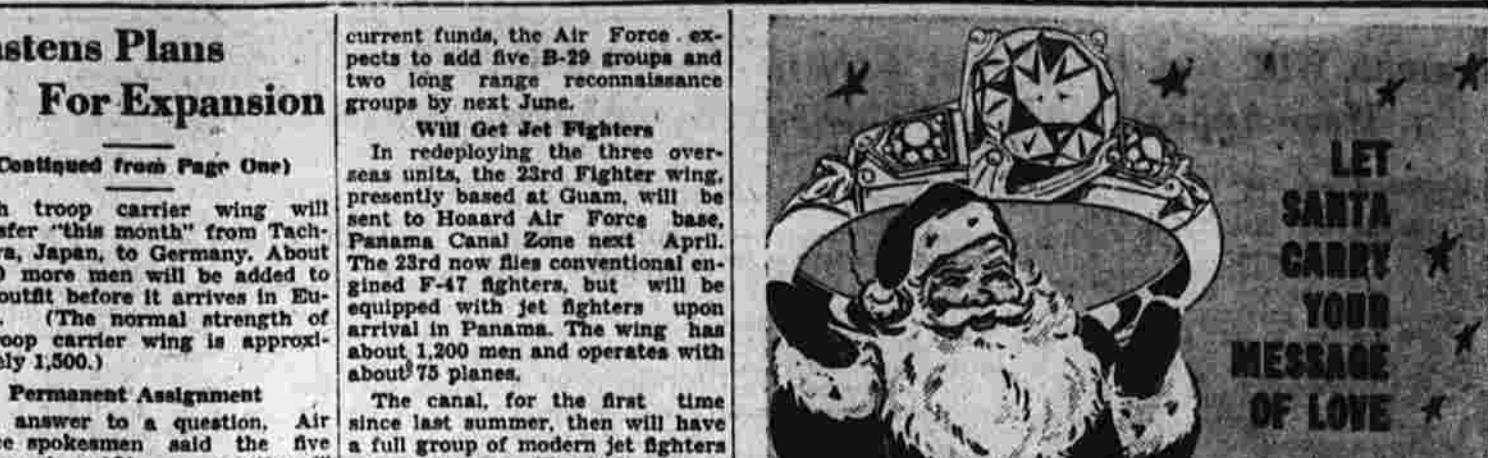

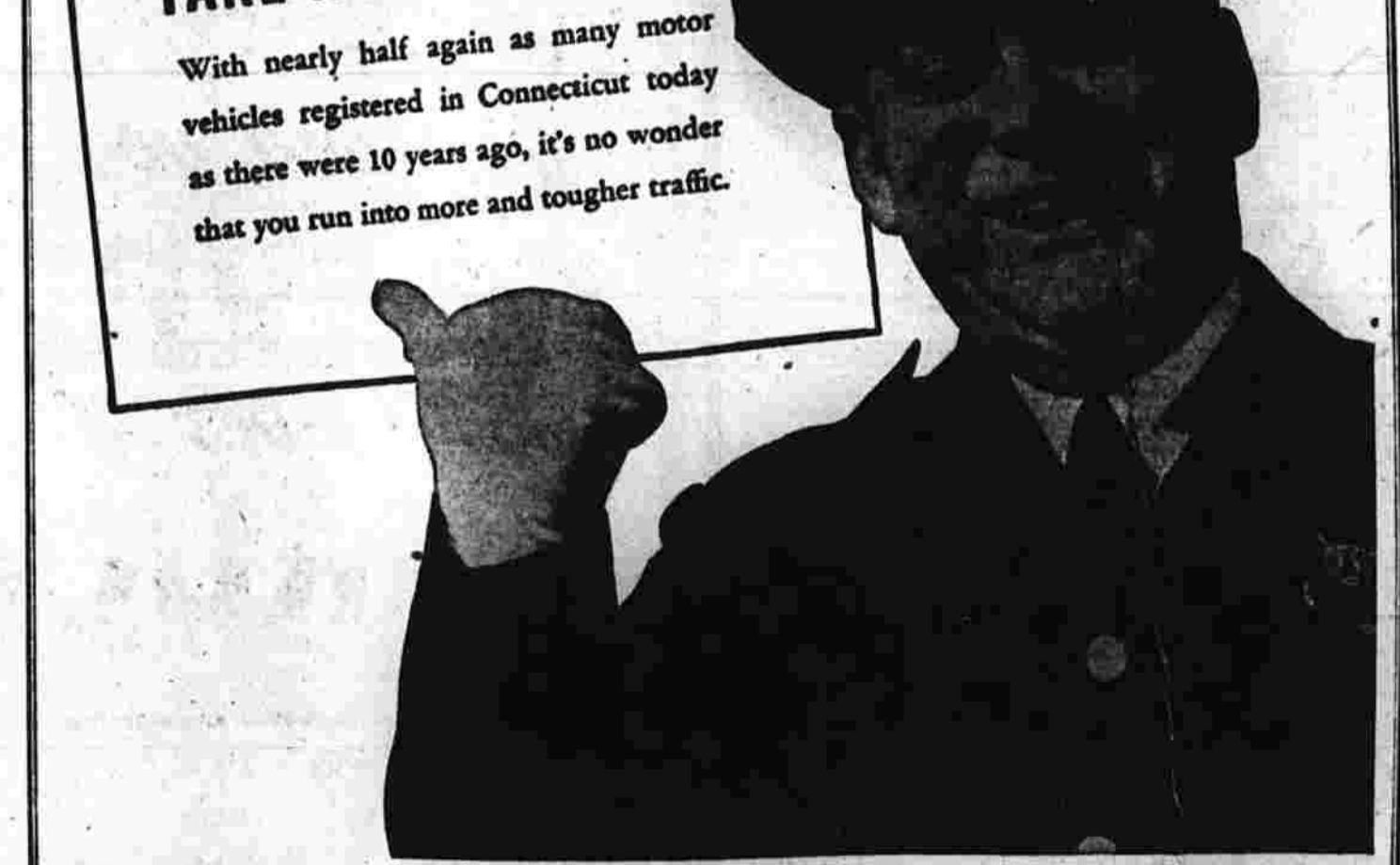

### Dentists Get More Money

Rocket Into Big Income Under British Health Service Plan

London, Dec. 10.—(AP)—British dentists never had it so good. Under Britain's nationalized health service, providing "free" dental care, they have rocketed into the big money.

The dentists like the new system and they plan to fight tooth and nail Health Minister Aneurin Bevan's decision to cut their earnings, made by treating Britons' teeth and billing the Health Ministry.

Bevan said more than 100 dentists of the 9,000 in the plan are each grossing more than 12,000 pounds (about \$48,000) a year. Between 75 and 100 others, he said, are making some 6,000 pounds each.

That is big money in Britain where the average dentist used to gross about 2,000 pounds a year.

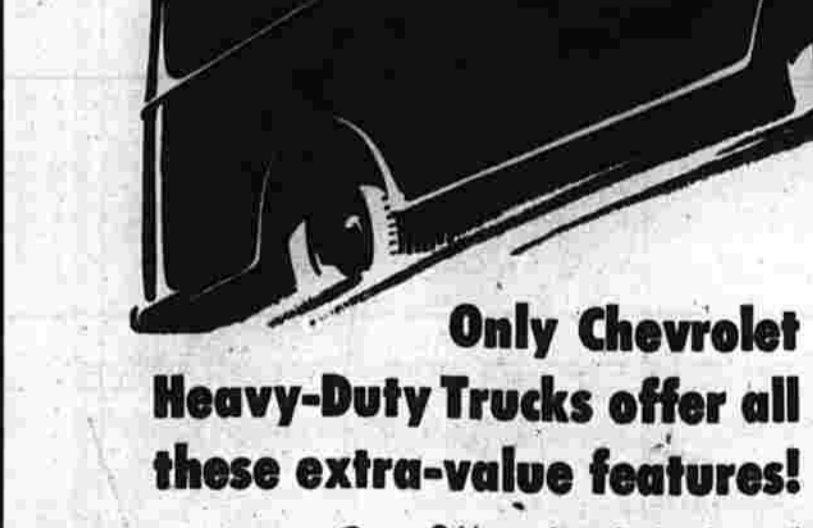
