Urges Caution Making Loans

Shippee Advises Points To Be Watched in Lending Process

Chicago, Dec. 14.—A Connecticut banker today urged his fellow bankers to use more caution in lending.

Lester E. Shippee, executive vice president of the Hartford-Connecticut Trust company, Hartford, made this recommendation in an address prepared for the National Bankers association meeting at the credit conference of the American Bankers association among points he said should be watched in the lending process were:

Maintenance of a "liquid" position sufficiently strong to guard against foreseeable contingencies.

The ratio of debt to the borrower's capital "has risen substantially in a great many businesses, and this unhealthy trend cannot be viewed with complacency by either borrower or lender."

Frequent trade checks should be made since "slowing up in payments may be a sign of trouble in the making."

Better Accounting Needed

Bankers "must obtain more frequent and complete financial statements and income accounts than we have called for in the past. It is of great importance for banks to insist upon better accounting methods on the part of a large number of borrowers."

A second speaker, Walter W. Webb, vice president of the W. J. Webb Bank and Trust company, Worcester, Mass., said that banks' most difficult problem may be the "unintentional speculation in investments."

"Large inventories have already been accumulated in some industries. The most part of drastic price cuts have not been used to date to move these slow inventories."

"The large producers have preferred to maintain prices and carry the inventories rather than reduce their prices and take lesser profits or actual losses to get their stocks of goods down to figures more in line with sales."
