Washington — (NEA) — Two valuable aids to mass flying which the Civil Aeronautics Administration has developed after long experimentation are now being produced on the aviation market, the CAA has announced.

One is the caster-type landing gear, which makes landings possible even when runways do not face directly into the wind. The second is an automatic stallwarning device which tells a pilot when his plane is in danger of a spin.

The caster-type landing gear, which swivels like the wheels on an office chair, was perfected some time ago for small planes, and now has proved equally practical on aircraft as large as the DC-3. It permits a plane to turn its nose into a cross-wind and still roll along the ground in the direction of the runway.



Many birthmarks are made up of numerous tiny blood vessels in the skin. Some are level with the surface of the skin but have a dark purplish color which gives them the common name of port wine mark. Some birthmarks made up of blood vessels are raised above the skin level and are soft and spongy. These are called strawberry marks. This type may occur anywhere, but is particularly common around the particularly common around the lips or tongue. Another common variety of birthmark made up of blood vessels is irregularly shaped and slightly raised. It is called a spider nevus because of the resemblance to this invest.

The proper treatment for a birthmark depends on the loca-tion, the size, and the particular variety of the defect.
