New Way of Measur-

By Howard W. Biakeabe Associated Press Science Edition New Haven, Dec. 29—(4)—To a look at the new moon and for yourself just how far you are from the sun. This way of measuring the sun's distance was reported to the American Astronomical society today by Prof. Dirk Brouwer, of Yale university.
It comes out that the sun is cozy forty thousand miles nearer than believed. New distance, 92.-

The trick is to measure the slowdown in movement of the new moon as it come, around the carth's edge right after New Year's. It is then moving away from the sun, which is on the opposite side of the world.

Slows Like Dog on Leash The moon slows like a dog on a leash. The celestial leash is the sun's gravitational pull. By the time the queen of the night is half

full she will be 13? miles short o the place in the sky where she ought to be.
That distance can be seen with the naked eye, even at 240,000 miles. It is one-fifteenth of the moon's apparent diameter.

After full moon the night orb
makes up the loss by speeding up
as she approaches the sun again.
The old moon, at half full, is 133

miles ahead of schedule.



And when security is the primary objective, idealism must be secondary. For example, it is considered more important to improve the industrial output of western Germany than to a or India at this time.



During recent years, more and more has been heard about a peculiar disease of the lungs which is usually called virus pneumonia as a typical pneumonia. This disease is probably caused by one or more viruses which are tiny living organisms too small to see under the ordinary microscope.

Typical virus pneumonia starts much like influenza, which is also a virus disease. Cough and running eyes and nose are common early symptoms. The lungs are affected early. When an X-ray film is taken, the lungs are sure to have a patchy appearance quite different from the better known form of pneumonia caused by the germ known as the pneumococcus and spoken of as lobar pneumonia.

Lungs Affected

The reason for this failure to recover more rapidly after the active symptoms have departed is not known. However, X-ray films often continue to show some patchy appearance in the lungs for a long time after the acute signs have disappeared.

Penicillin and similar preparations as well as the sulfa drugs do not have any definite value in virus

At present, there is no good way to prevent wirus pneumonia except to avoid close contact with those who are infected. A satisfactory vaccine is not available for general
use, and treatment is disappointing. More research is badly needed.



Our efforts, however, will be directed toward putting the reactor in a ship. We're trying to build a ship's power plant that will burn uranium instead of ecal or oil."

According to an official of the Atomic Energy commission in Washington, the ship propulsion project will not be the first non-weapon development of atomic power undertaken.




